Well, I took the roller and started filling it with paint and rolling it on the wall. It was enough to complete the fover and then complete part way up the walls going up stairs. What it did mean though was that I didn't have enough paint to finish the first coat of it all. Sacramental Corner......

When Will We Open Again?

That is an interesting question. The Archdiocese hosted an online meeting with all the priests and lay people. The short answer is we have no idea, and considerations:

Social distancing will be a reality so how do we set up the churches to accommodate social distancing as the people enter and leave. How do they sit in the pews. Will they need to wear masks? Will the Church be allowed to distribute communion? Since the premises will need to restrict numbers, how will it be determined who is permitted to enter? Will reservations be needed? Or first come, first serve? Or will masses be allocated alphabetically by last name? The premises will need to be disinfected between each Mass.

Things in the church will be noticeably different. Music books will not be permitted in the pews. There is a question of whether the congregation will be permitted to sing and choirs may not be permitted studying, or where you will be working. to exercise their ministry. Altar servers may not be permitted to serve at the altar. If communion is permitted how will the two meter social distancing be maintained and who will usher the procession line? The collection basket is not allowed to be passed, so maybe the basket is left at the entrance and on the way out people make their offering. Will the collection need to be guarantined for a couple of days to ensure that the virus has died. washrooms may need to remain locked and not available for use.

Office hours will be curtailed and they will be phased in with as much work being done off premises as can be done. In the Office, walk in traffic will not be permitted, it will be by appointment only. Parish groups and meetings will Alana Brown-Wallace likely not be allowed and again, the premises will Janet Brockway need to be disinfected after each and every use.

If only about one third of the congregation will be Mary Ann Ferrer able to celebrate each week, do we wait until we can gather as one. And if we cannot distribute communion... there are so many questions to Betty Loft consider. One thing is for sure, when the doors do finally open, it will not be back to normal.


