Ruminations

Brown grass. I used to love having brown grass in the backyard and think it displayed its own form of beauty. It meant that the grass didn't need to be mowed. There was a couple of issues to moving our lawn. First there were a couple of nasty hills that precipitated the lawn mower flipping over a couple of times over the years. The front yard had a small hill at about a 70 degree slope. It wasn't always that way, but the Town raised the road substantially in front of our house and what once was a gentle rise where cars could park, became a treacherous cliff over which at least one car met the concept of gravity. It happened to be a visitor and at the time one wondered what lack of faculties they had, but in the end, very little damage was done to the yard, oh and the driver and the vehicle suffered only minor humiliation which continues to this day with the driver because every time we see him, the story is recounted again, and again. The backyard also was sloped toward the Holland River, which meant pushing up hill half the time and it was a long haul. Dad loved trees and so our backvard had quite a few trees that were planted without rhyme or reason, and as the evergreens matured, cutting around them created a bit of a complication. And the best time to cut it was always in the heat of the day. It was the best way to avoid the mosquito So when the high summer came and the grass turned brown, it was a great day. I was remembering this as I looked at the front yard of the Church property. It is the first time I have seen is like this. In the previous years, we had turned the irrigation system on and the three times a week watering early in the morning kept the lawn lush and green as well as watering the garden along the driveway. We opted not to initiate the irrigation system as a cost saving sacrifice. So if you see some of the plants in the garden suffering the heat of summer that is why. The gardens at the entrance of the church have been almost a full time job – if it weren't for the pandemic, I wouldn't have the time to water and weed them. The bare minimum takes about two hours a day except when it rains, and lugging that 100 foot hose around is a major bicep workout. We did not hire our landscapers this year again because of the precarious cash flow, thus all the time spent weeding this year. I also used one of the island gardens to plant some tomatoes, cantaloupe and pumpkins. The pumpkins have struggled and I have lost three plants but the cantaloupe are doing great. I have many little developing melons that should be ripe in about six weeks. The green beans are ready and I have enjoyed one of the tomatoes already. The one thing I have always found about brown grass is that it brings us a heavy dose of reality. Our manicured lawn always seemed a bit of defiance against



Mother Nature. Even air-conditioning (and please God let it always be part of my life) gives us an air of control over things that we don't have any control over. So in these hazy days of summer, I kind of revel in the brown lawn – it can be existential.


