

Ruminations

I have trapped chipmunks, squirrels, groundhogs and rabbits invading my patio or the gardens. At present I am disputing property rights with another chipmunk. He thinks he has a right to tunnel a home in the middle of the garden beside the office door. I am adamant that he does not, and so the dispute continues. I haven't had the time to work the trap to capture and relocate him so I have defaulted to another approach. I have filled in his tunnels only to find another one pop up next to it, and I have tried to drown him by leaving the nozzle of the hose on full blast. Somehow he manages to survive. I thought it was cats that have nine lives. My next attempt is spraying the area with some formula that is supposedly a scent that drives them away. It doesn't seem to be working. Probably in the same way that I am starting to like the smell of the ever present disinfectant, it seems that this dastardly chipmunk has acquired a liking of the concoction of peppermint leaf oil, cinnamon, rosemary oil, egg white solids among other things. It sounds like a recipe for some exotic Thai food dish. No wonder he is staying put. 
