Ruminations

It didn't take long for the weather to take a turn to the more comfortable. Thankfully the brutal heat of summer is giving way to the moderate temperatures of the soon to arrive Autumn. The grass is still lush and green though the flowers are starting to look spent. The demands are diminished and it is time to start thinking about cleaning them out and planting the Spring bulbs and I think planting some garlic cloves for next summer. The coming of the cooler weather also means that visits to mom will move indoors which will necessitate more Covid tests every two weeks to be able to visit her. I had my first indoor visit last week. It took place in the room that they call the chapel which seems very fitting. The rules are still strict, she remains six feet away behind a table which prevents any physical contact. Mom was sitting there after having just had her hair done. It was rather short but they had attached a bow to the side of her head which reminded me of Rosemary from the Dick van Dyke show. If the truth be told, mom always hated the idea of placing a bow in her hair. I'm not sure if it was because mom was more tombovish playing sports or just her fashion sense. Whatever the history with bows, she didn't seem to mind it now. One thing that the workers have always said about mom was that she was constantly smiling. That is exactly how she was when I sat down across from her. She didn't seem to recognize me or really even focus on my presence. As I tried to engage her in she seemed oblivious. It just confirmed what I already knew, I was never her favorite. She spend most of the half hour unfocused, and humming to herself and giggling at herself and smiling, and nodding off to sleep. I tried getting a picture of her to send to my brothers and mom's best friend in Newfoundland. It was hard to get her to be still, and unlike her pre-dementia days when she loved having her picture taken, it was next to impossible to get her to pose or sit still. So I called her trying to get her look towards me. When she heard the call she looked rather stunned and interrupted so when I sent the photo around, the various comments all remarked that she looked sad, or angry or unhappy. I must admit that it was not the most flattering photo and there is element whereby she did look like a deer caught in the headlights. It belies how the visit really went. So I explained that the camera simply captured an awkward moment in time that was not indicative of the overall visit. I'm not sure that in mom's state



of mind if she is even capable of prolonged anger. But I did concede that if mom had seen how short her hair was, and how they had placed the long dreaded bow in her hair, she might indeed have been ticked off. We just got notice today that her floor is on a lock down and so visits are curtailed into the near future.


