## **Ruminations** ....

It was getting that time again when I had to make the trek to my doctor for my three month checkup. As a diabetic it is one of those things. On occasion when the doctor had put refills on my prescriptions I would wait until the near end of the prescription which meant that sometimes I wouldn't see him for a year. He wasn't too happy with that so the length of the prescriptions would get shorter. Sometimes I could circumvent that strategy by going to the Walk in Clinic and getting them to renew itbut they soon caught on to my wily plots. About five minutes before opening, they opened the clinic inviting everyone to form a line. Well it was a mad rush with everyone for themselves, and with no regard for the early arrivers. Arguments broke out as the new comers lunged their way to the front of the line. I kept thinking that it was too early for these needless hostilities so I took my place about eight people further along the line than my early diligence warranted. The difference ended up being about 10 minutes. As I registered, again my doctor had already submitted my requisition before I had arrived. To be honest, as a great procrastinator, I was in no hurry to get jabbed, and since it is rare that they catch a vein on the first shot, the line could have been longer. It was amazingly rather speedy and before I knew it, I was sitting in the cubicle as the nurse went from arm to arm trying to find a vein. Finally she settled on the left arm and almost miraculously hit the vein first jab. As she was taping the wound, she commented that the tape was the most painful part of the procedure and I whole-heartedly agreed. I was on my way after twenty minutes from opening and headed to Shoppers Drug Mart to see if my doctor did


