Ruminations

The last 'normal' thanksgiving we had was four years ago. It wasn't typical, there was no turkey or potatoes, or mom's atrocious carrots and mushroom soup concoction. Anything with mushrooms or fungus is a violation of the natural order of things in my humble opinion. It was celebrated here in the rectory because mom was living with me as her dementia grew. We had years ago begun a new tradition of Chinese Food from Dragon King in Holland Landing and everyone was here except my youngest brother. I'm not sure we invited him, but we likely did. He traditionally has had his own thanksgiving routine with in-laws and grandkids and a healthy two and a half hour drive. That was the last time we gathered with mom. That following Christmas a few weeks later had a bit of a pall over it. Unbeknownst to mom, events had precipitated a call to the Community Care Access Centre to find a place better capable of taking care of the ever more demands of mom. This year has been a strange year on many fronts, none the least of which is the very limited opportunities to visit mom. Since the restrictions for visiting homes was eased, I have seen mom twice. It is such a strain on the home to provide these highly regulated visits that as a family we decided to visit her once a week and so we took turns. At first each visit required a Covid test. Then that was lifted for outdoor visits, but as the weather changed, all visits took place indoors and the Covid requirement was re-instated. Shortly after my first indoor visit, mom's floor went into lockdown and we were no longer able to visit her – again. The nurse has assured us that mom is fine and not afflicted with whatever has generated her floor's lockdown. Now with the upsurge of Covid numbers again in this apparent wave 2 event, our family plans have been thwarted. Our concern for social bubbles have come to dominate the plans. We have a healthcare worker who is very conscientious about protecting her family and patients, a high school principal who is exposed to so many students every day, and a priest who is in the midst of a growing number of people attending weekend masses. As the medical experts remind us, there is no guarantee of prevention, only precautions that serve to lessen the chances of contracting the virus. Prudence is the buzz word for this year's thanksgiving. If truth be told, the quiet and stillness that the virus has elicited has become a welcome by product and although we are not gathering physically as a family, we certainly will be present in another way. So despite the odd circumstances it will be very much a day of thanksgiving. Mom has survived Covid. My nephew is in Ireland at school pursuing his passion. The family is healthy except for the new medication my doctor has prescribed for my elevated cholesterol numbers. My student nieces and nephews are still able to continue their education. I was able to buy the very last Snoopy Halloween decoration from the Hallmark store, and the second last Charlie Brown Christmas



decoration. I have already planned my menu from Dragon King. Although I am looking forward to a quiet thanksgiving by myself, I will be far from being alone. Life is good. Give Thanks.
