

Ruminations

I'm not really one of those jump into Christmas mode early. I must confess that I am one of the early birds when the new Hallmark Peanuts decorations go on display in mid-July but that is because they have trained us well, that if we wait for a more seasonable time, it is already too late. In fact, I was a little slow off the mark this year and didn't show up until the end of July and I picked up the last Charlie Brown ornament. That was too close so I have already set a reminder on my phone for next July. I do keep my eyes open for various things to contribute to our Christmas display or nativity scenes, but these are more stumble upon treasures rather than deliberate shopping ventures. I was at Lee Valley for an item, a battery operated motion activated light for the top of the stairs because it is so dark now in the mornings and I have this fear of tumbling down the stairs trying to find the light switch. It works great by the way. They did have a bag for carrying spent Christmas trees out of the house and after years of dealing with the Christmas trees in the Church, and dragging them 100 feet out the doors. and then having to deal with needles and carpets, I thought this would be a perfect solution to make life easier. Although it is something that is used at Christmas, I don't really consider that Christmas shopping. I also saw something that I think my nephew will really like so I picked it up. Usually for my nieces and nephews they would rather have a gift card to the Mall or cash. They are not too fond of my choices of other things – obviously they do not have good taste. With regard to decorations though, we have chatted about putting the nativity sets out early. Because of Covid restrictions that will likely be with us long after Christmas, our normal beautiful Nativity display will be limited to the Hall which isn't being used anyway, we can spread them out so it is easier and safer to have families and people come to see them. But how to display them? That is the question. We could just plop them on tables but we don't generally roll like that. We have been experimenting and pondering and searching for inspiration. But it is hard, because as a liturgist, it just goes against the grain about doing it before Christmas. I have never displayed them early and have spoken snidely to schools that put them out. So every time we discuss it, a shudder runs down my spine. Advent is a season of waiting and anticipation, and here I am considering putting them out early. I look in the mirror and just shake my head. But I think of a greater good, it will allow children and families to have an outing and a fun activity. So if you see me walking aimlessly, hitting my head with the heel of my hand mumbling to myself that I killed



Christmas, don't worry, or wearing a paper bag over my head because I am too ashamed to face my liturgical friends, just give me a wide birth and let the liturgical season unfold as it has for centuries. Sixty-two days and counting.

COVID PROTOCOL REMINDER

When Cardinal Collins accepted the Government's offer to open places of Worship with limited numbers of maximum 30% and with the social distancing requirements it meant our capacity is more like 17%, he laid out specific criteria or conditions.
