Ruminations

Autumn has always been my favorite time of year. The blistering heat of summer has abated, and more importantly, the bugs are for the most part There is something mystical about the metamorphosis that transforms the canopies of summer green into the rich palette of vellows and reds and oranges. And the flowers that have spent their energies on myriads of blossoms of various shapes and colours fade into the slumber awaiting the warmth of spring rays to burst into their kaleidoscope displays next year. Autumn is a quieting season that invigorates you with fresh crisp days and pleasant chores of the season's last harvesting. Usually in the midst of these days of low sun and waning daylight, we are blessed with a few days of warm, almost perfect and glorious days. We called it Indian Summer, though I am unsure if that is still politically correct, and my apologies if it is, and I would offer a new moniker, Roy's Summer as an alternative since it is my favorite time. This past Friday was one of the perfect Autumn days, sunny and warm and no bugs. My plans for the day were to seize the opportunity for the final harvest of tomatoes, clean up the gardens and get my garlic planted for next year's reaping. So I started fairly early by pulling the tomato plants and raking up the ground cover in the parking lot islands. Then it was clipping back the daylilies to ground level, or as close to ground level as my body would go. It is amazing how much greenery that nature can pack into such small spaces. It was taking longer than I anticipated and although it was slower going, it was so wonderful being connected to the soil and the sun, that there was no great sense of urgency. As the hours passed, marked so romantically by the tolling of those bells provided by the CWG a few years back, the bending and kneeling and raking and rising flowed effortlessly. I remember thinking to myself after about 5 or 6 hours out there that I was doing exceptionally well as a 60 year old. I felt invigorated and age defiant. I certainly noticed how quickly the sun is setting and I started to speed up a bit to give some semblance of cleaning all the stems, and roots that were strewn about the parking lot. I also had to concede that I wasn't going to get it all done as I had planned, but it was such a gorgeous day that there were no regrets or disappointment. I just hoped that there would be a few more of these Indian Summer days to finish my chores. Self-satisfied, I plunked myself down in the chair as darkness enshrouded the gardens, and breathed a deep sigh of accomplishment and contentment. It was a perfect day, and this old body was none the worse for wear. Saturday morning I had a memorial funeral and as I was mounting the steps to the altar, these muscles in my legs that I never knew existed brought me a great dose of humility. Maybe I was mercifully free of pain on the Friday, but for the rest of the weekend, every time I had to climb the altar steps, I was reminded of the delusion of youth that I was living under as I came crashing back to reality. All that bending and stretching and lowering and rising did indeed take a toll on these bones. In the kitchen I dropped something on the floor and as I tried to stoop to



pick it up, I was reminded of the cost of my labours, and it remained on the floor for a couple of days, and I didn't care. It was with great reluctance I had to concede that maybe I'm not as young as I thought. Maybe that is what Shakespeare meant with "Love's Labour's Lost" or maybe that is what he should have meant.


