

Ruminations

I have to confess that I was rather relieved when I heard that we would be locked down for Christmas. Not that it makes my life easier, because it does, and not because it will be the first Christmas in over thirty years that I will be able to sleep in, because I can, but there was this fear and foreboding surrounding the whole spectacle of Christmas Eve masses. For a few weeks now we have been fielding calls from people expressing their intention to attend Christmas Eve citing that they have avoided the church because of CoVid, but they really wanted to attend for Christmas. A very noble sentiment of course, but the reality is that with very limited capacity to seat people (we have needed to turn people away), the very thought of the people who have been coming on a regular basis, and those who had been coming prior to the pandemic, and then, those who only come at Christmas and Easter, the fact of the matter would be that there is no room at the Inn. I envisioned anger and hostility and disappointment and arguing and frustration at the entrance. Nobody needs that to start the Christmas season, or to have the church tell people that they are not welcomed. So I did breathe a sigh of relief and I slept a bit better than night. I still have a hard time with our limits because it is an awful liturgical sign to celebrate a sacrament of unity when from the very beginning, the community is fractured. Did I mention that I get to sleep in for the first time in thirty years. I did get my fix of young people over the last couple of weeks. I celebrated Mass with one of the schools – virtually, and I am in the process of visiting all the classes in another school – virtually. Our technology allows such marvellous opportunities though I must confess that it has been the occasion of some untoward language trying to maneuver through this wondrous technology. It was fascinating connecting into the classrooms. I could see they kids, and they could see me. I put a Christmassy backdrop behind me thanks to the google meet options. The one day I was wearing red and the kindergartens first thought that Santa Claus was visiting their classroom. No more red on these virtual meetings. We also had the children who are attending class from home. Now that was an eve opener. There was the young fellow who got into a fight with his brother on line. There was the young girl who just got bored in the middle of my visit and got up and started dancing and twirling around. There was the young boy who just left his chair and came back a couple of minutes later with a great big sandwich and glass of milk. My visits were slated for 20 minutes and having experienced what our teachers go through for the whole day, the amount of energy needed to try to animate kids in class and virtually - at the same time was absolutely exhausting. If truth be told, I had a little nap after my



day of visiting – well maybe a bit more than a little nap. I know enough teachers and I have heard the pressures and difficulties that this new format was placing on them. Having experienced it first hand, in twenty minute intervals, as much as we owe a great sense of gratitude to our front line workers, our teachers are doing a herculean heroic job. So teachers, enjoy this Christmas break, a small reprieve for going above and beyond.
