On occasion a friend will post something to my Facebook page. Now I do not frequent that page very often. The only reason I ever signed up was to check up on my nieces and nephews, clean up the language and make them delete stuff that was maybe too much information. It wasn't long before they vacated Facebook for other social media where a luddite uncle couldn't follow. Recently there was a list of foods and we were asked to indicate how many foods on the last we would not eat. People would post the number of foods they wouldn't eat. Scores were 3 or 5. Someone had marked a score of 7 and all kinds of comments were made about this fussy eater. Well, it was with great reluctance that I posted my score. Let's just say that there were more foods on my 'don't eat list' than on my 'eat list'. I scored a whopping 19. It's not really my fault, they just listed a lot of the foods I don't eat, fish and fungus and ... Let's just say no one was really surprised, though they were a little caught off guard by some of the things that remained on the edible side – Brussel sprouts and buttermilk. The other day one of my nephews stopped by to see his favorite uncle, or to pick up something- same thing in my books. There is nothing like the roll of the eyes when you invite him to take his boots off and come sit down for a chat. Regardless, it was a nice visit. So I offered him something to drink. Anyway, my nephew wasn't too interested in a glass of buttermilk, even when I tried to entice him with a dash of salt. I told him that I just don't get these fussy eaters and I tried to coax him to give it a try, to no avail. It will soon be the 17 anniversary of my dad's passing and it was fun to recount stories about him to the generation that has such a short lived memory of him, and every



time I fill a glass with that cold, delicious buttermilk, I can't help but think of dad, and maybe that is why it tastes especially delicious even still.
