Ruminations

I was out for a walk the other night. It has been a couple of days. Even though I profess a great affinity for the hijinks of winter, we have been relatively spoiled and I haven't developed my winter blood vet to the stormy, windy cold days exhausted my motivation and the enticement of warm indoors with a cup of hot chocolate sitting beside my Christmas tree that was still up (it came down on Tuesday) won out. It has been enchanting walking especially approaching the church building aglow with the magic of the Christmas lights (which were also shut off on Tuesday). I often wondered what people thought as they drove past the church weeks after the most ardent of Christmas fans had extinguished their lights. I am pretty confident that most people have no idea about the feast of the Presentation, but maybe someday their curiosity will prompt them to explore an answer to why the Catholic church has kept their lights on so long. So Tuesday was a hectic day as finally the time had come to dismantle the last vestiges of Christmas. There were no tears shed as the depleted and almost leafless poinsettias were tossed into the garbage. But it was with a mild reluctance when the day's chores turned to the Hall and the almost 100 nativity sets that were on display. The last scheduled tour of the display was Monday afternoon. Last week, the long awaited nativity set from Mongolia arrived. invasion was an invasion of cuteness. Only two families got to see this version of an Asian Holy Family, something to look forward to this year's edition in 294 days. A couple of little elves helped as the bubble wrap and containers crowded the Hall floor. It was way easier assembling than disassembling these treasures. There are dozens and dozens of containers of all sizes with the names of the countries written on the sides. One might think that this would make it easy to sort and store, but in fact, rarely does the nativity set make it into the clear container out of which it came. Each of the containers have names all scratched out and new names written in marker over top the scribbled out names. Consider that some of the containers go back nine years and the writing on the plastics resemble hieroglyphics. When the display was in the church alcove, we had a limited amount of shelving space that we had honed over a number of years. The move to the hall clearly gave us more than enough room, but it also meant that we had to hunt down units to be able to display them. Offices, sitting rooms, bedrooms were all pilfered trying to find display stands. In the end, we still purchased some extra shelves, as well as cute picket fencing to keep some young excitable folks from hurting themselves or the nativities. The question now is,

where can we store all these pieces for next year. Most of our storage areas are already filled and that is even after purging these places in anticipation of our pending fire inspection. I guess we will need to appeal to St. Vincent Ferrer, patron saint of construction to bring us some more storage.
