Ruminations

In my final year of my undergrad in Sports Administration I knew I had a bit of an uneasy feeling. Part of the issue was that after four years, it was just time to move on. The novelty of university and residence life had run its course and residence because merely functional. I remember walking down the hall one day recognizing that it was time- that my time here was done. Also the program was not the problem, it was great and exciting but maybe just not for me. I really didn't know where I was I had looked at teachers' college and I even had the application, but something was holding me back. I also wrote my LSAT test which is a requirement for Law School, but I kept hearing my mother's voice saying that she didn't care what I became so long as it wasn't a politician or a lawyer. In the final year there was always a field trip to various professional organizations. Our trip was to Toronto visiting Adidas, and then off to New York to meet with various NBA and NHL organizations, but at best my heart was in the Olympic committees and so I opted out of the field trip. The trip coincided with the start of Lent and since several of my classes we cancelled because the professors were off on the field trip, I had some time on my hands. My residence was connected with the Catholic college run by the French Jesuits and so naturally there was a chapel were mass was held. Most of the masses were in French or bilingual which was a neat experience. So several times a week I started attending the noon weekday Mass for Lent. The chapel was absolutely beautiful. It was rather small seating about 20 people in the round with the altar in the middle. The windows were tall, narrow pillars all stained glass, and at noon, when the sun was high in the sky, the glow was mystical. There were never more than a few people in attendance so it was very intimate. When my class returned from the trip to the Big Apple and I heard all the stories of meeting the sports bigwigs, and the adventures of a group of young people in New York, I was more content with my decision to forego the opportunity. The final weeks of school had a new sense of urgency to complete the essays and projects and thoughts turned to graduation. I was looking forward to my last Easter Vigil. I didn't really understand why. The previous year's experience at the Vigil was enchanting and best, afforded me the luxury of sleeping in. All the entertainment activities like dances, banquets, and the resident pub and coffee house which sold lots of doughnuts and absolutely no coffee was closed for the season. The priest that was the main presider at most of the masses during Lent asked to speak to me one day. He took me aside and asked me if I was thinking of the priesthood. I was a bit taken aback, because it was not on my agenda. My brother had already made his purpose of entering into the seminary and it seemed ludicrous that two sons of the same family would head down that path. I told him with great confidence that I was determined to end up working for the Canadian Olympic Committee.

Either I was unconvincing or he was unconvinced, but that was the last conversation about that, until a year and a half later I had to ask him to write me a recommendation letter for the seminary. Not sure if he chuckled to himself, but he should have.
