Ruminations

They say that if March comes in like a lion, it goes out like a lamb. This March 1 was one of those lion days with snowing and blowing. I had been nursing some dental issues, over the days leading up to the beginning of the new month. I had been rinsing with salt water, flossing constantly, sucking on ice chips, rubbing the area with Sensodyne tooth paste, and popping doses of Tylenol trying to find some comfort to be able to get through the day and through the night. At best it would provide a bit of relief, but not much and the pain would always return. It had got to the point where I conceded that I needed to go see my dentist. As I explained to him, it was bad enough for me to make a voluntary trip to see him – first time in over six decades, so it must be extremely uncomfortable. I woke several times Sunday night, getting up to rinse with salt water, and when I finally made it still alive Monday morning, it seemed back to normal without any pain. Even though I had resolved to call the dentist early in the morning when they first opened, the lack of pain seemed to make it unnecessary. I kept waiting to the return of the pain, but it never came, until shortly after noon. I just hoped that I hadn't missed the opportunity for an emergency visit. Luckily they could fit me in and as is typical, the minute I pulled into my parking space in front of his office, all pain disappeared. As I sat in the chair with pokes and prods, and banging and tapping, nothing would reactive the pain. It was M.I.A. He politely concluded that it was likely a popcorn kernel or some such foreign object had been lodged in the gums, done a bit of a number on the gums and was trying to heal, and every time I flossed thinking that there was a foreign object, I opened a wound preventing it from healing. Somehow popcorn didn't seem to qualify as a dental emergency. He probably wrote it off as senile over 60 types with paranoia and too much time on their hands. Anyway, driving home I experienced white out conditions as the snow was blowing across the open farm fields. I thought, gee, they need snow fences. Suddenly I noticed that none of the fields had any snow fences. Years ago, one of the sure tail signs of the coming of winter was all the farm fields been lined with those red snow fences to limit snow creating the exact white-outs I was experiencing. These fences were a staple of rural life. They lined fields, and highways and anywhere there were open fields. It just seemed to be part of living in the Great White North. And it seemed every time we had to play hockey in Alliston, we experienced these white out conditions. and once coming home from a hockey tournament in Huntsville, we were the last convoy of cars that made it along the 400 highway before a massive, massive pile up of cars, brought on by the blowing snow. So

it was a pretty lion day, and as the days lengthen and the sun is higher in the sky, if the old adage holds true, let's hope this snowy, blustery day is heralding a lamblike exit of winter into the sunny promise of Spring.


