It was probably not the best business decision so close to a bunch of university residences with students who had small budgets and big appetites. Some students had Kraft dinner as a staple, we had pizza. After university Pizza Pizza was building itself into a cultural norm and for me, it became the pizza of choice. And of course one of the most endearing aspects of that pizza chain is that they opened a store in Holland Landing. But that created a bit of a quandary because there is another pizza store in the Landing. If you had told me while I was growing up that Holland Landing would have three sets of stoplights, two pizzerias and one Chinese Food stores, I would have asked you to check your medication. Sante Fe pizza is the go to place for special occasions. This past weekend was a bit hectic starting on Friday when my two nephews and I started some serious garden preparations and moving of hedges and things. It continued on Saturday with two funerals and some other tasks so when it was time for dinner, In my exhaustion I opted to do something rather unusual, I ordered pizza. It has become rare because of my diabetes, but it was both reward and concession. Someone has mentioned about this glorious pizza place that makes the best pizza. So since my regular Pizza Shop has closed down, I decided to give it a try. I called and they told me half an hour so I made my way there at the appointed time. I went in and was told that it wasn't in the oven yet that they were swamped and if I could come back in 45 minutes. Now 20 minutes or 30 minutes or else it's free is a popular draw, and there have been several occasions when I was entitled, but I never accepted the offers. I realize how hard some of those jobs can be and if I have to wait a couple minutes longer, no big deal. I was not a happy patron but when I returned it was ready. I couldn't wait to get home with the consolation that I was about to dig into the most

delicious pizza ever. Well, it was not that delicious, in fact it was a huge disappointment, and I will not be ordering pizza from there again, and their name will remain anonymous. I hear Sante Fe has an Aurora store.
