What does Phase 3 mean for Us?

We have moved into Phase 3. In terms of our Church capacity, nothing changes. The six foot social distancing requirement means that our limit in the Church remains 100 people. What has changed is that we are permitted to use the Parish Hall for overflow so long as we maintain the social distancing.

We are awaiting further direction from the Archdiocese about hours of operation among other items.

The Episcopal board of the Archdiocese has been looking seriously at this situation asking such things as who will be returning when the doors open fully especially when the reality is that many who are attending now fall into the fragile sector. A strong liturgical case can be made for reducing it to one Mass. At some point, Mass times became a matter of convenience and not community and communal identity became defined by Mass time and not Parish. Lots of thinking between then and now.
