

#### **Ruminations** ....

I have to say that Thanksgiving weekend was arguably one of the nicest weather-wise, that I can remember. The temperatures were particularly balmy compared to some of the wet, cold, rainy ones that I can remember. I still remember that every year at university. we had our first snowfall of the season before the end of September, so this warm, comfortable, mosquito-free weekend was much appreciated. If our summer temperatures were as pleasant and comfortable, it may become my favorite season. My special meals over the course of the weekend included delicious home-made (not by me) cabbage rolls and the requisite meatball sub from Mr. Sub. It would not have been so good from Subway, though I keep thinking of trying the Firehouse version. Someday, maybe. Sunday night I was experimenting with a cheese cake recipe as I have been invited to a friend's for dinner on Friday and I am in charge of dessert. I found this tantalizing recipe for a Caramelized Apple that if it tastes anywhere close to the picture will be a hit. It is a bit more involved than I am used to so I wanted to try it out first instead of waiting to the last minute and deciding to trek off to the store and buy a Sara Lee version. It requires an apple bourbon that gave me pause. I didn't even know what bourbon was except a street in New Orleans. I always feel out of place at the LCBO. Having an allergy to alcohol, it is not a place I feel comfortable in and I don't know the difference between the various sorts of liquor. I was searching for a brand of bourbon and I wasn't sure where to find it. As I was searching through the wine section, feeling lost and exasperated, one of the staff asked if they could help. First she informed me I was in the wrong section – like big surprise. I showed her a picture of what I was looking for and she led me to what was supposed to be its location. It wasn't there. I told her that the internet said they had 10 bottles. She informed me that the internet isn't always right - again, big surprise. She went off to some computer to check the store inventory and returned with a bottle of it. Thev had showcased it away from its proper shelf. An apple anything sounds inviting to me and I expected an apple cider-like taste. I love apple cider as did my dad. Whenever apple cider season came around, it was a big treat which dad loved drinking even though he meant that shortly after he would break out in hives. So I tried a bit of this apple bourbon, just a tiny sip, merely wetting my lips really, and it tasted awful. I couldn't drink enough water to get rid of the taste. So now I was worried about adding this hellish brew to my recipe. It was added to the apple topping for the cheese cake as well as the caramel sauce on top. It didn't seem like the taste could get lost in the dessert. I was afraid to taste it lest I would have to surrender to Sara Lee. When I summoned the courage to give it a taste, it was actually really delicious except for this peculiar taste, the apple

bourbon. So when I make it for Friday's dinner, I am definitely either omitting the liqueur or substituting an orange liqueur instead. What would Chef Ramsay do?
