The Twelve Days of Christmas

Long ago, before play stations, IPods, Television & even radios, families played intergenerational parlour games, had family sing-a-longs, and dances in their homes to entertain themselves and while away the time. 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' has its origins in just such a place. It was a child's memorization game, played mostly on 12th Night, the eve before the end of the 12 days of Christmas.

The gifts of each day that we have come to know, were not the only gifts in town. Many different versions and variations are still in existence today, from peacocks in a pear tree, to hares a-running, or badgers baiting, to bears a-beating, men a-mowing, hounds a-running and lambs a-bleating. Never

anything about cats—amen. Every year, since 1984, the cost of the gifts has been listed as a tongue in cheek economic index. In 1984, the cost of the gifts tallied to \$12, 623.10. This year's Christmas index costs out at \$41,206.00.

The Oldest Christmas Carols

The Gloria to God in the Highest is considered the oldest Christmas Carol. Long before it became part of the Mass it was used by Pope Telesphorus around the years 128-139 ad. as part of the Mass for Christmas Day.

Then from France came "Jesus, Light of all the Nations, written between 310 & 367 ad. By St. Hilary of Poitier.

Another oldie but goodie is 'Of the Father's love begotten', from the Roman province of northern Spain. It was written sometime between 348 - 413 ad. by a man named Aurelius Prudentius Clemens.

In the 12th & 13th centuries, carols about animals were in vogue so

there was 'The Friendly Beasts' and also 'Between the Ox and the Grey Donkey'. These are both from France.

Then in the 14th century, around 1328. a popular carol that is still with us 'In dulce Jublio' or what we know as 'Good Christians all Rejoice was composed in Germany.

Christmas Quiz Answers

- While the religious advent season celebrated by Christians technically starts four full weeks before Christmas, the celebratory advent calendars most folks use today usually begin on December 1 and date back to the 19th century. The tradition was first started by German Protestants who lit candles or made chalk marks on doors every day during the month of December.
- The tradition came about thanks to a legend that states the generous Turkish bishop St. Nicholas helped a set of three poor sisters avoid a life of indentured servitude by paying for their dowries. For three nights, the bishop threw gold down their chimney, which landed in their stockings hung by their fireplace to dry. Now we carry on the tradition by hanging stockings to fill with gifts and small treats.

- The premiere of Handel's "Messiah" One of the glories of German music, Handel's oratorio "Messiah" was first performed in Dublin at the New Music Hall in Fishamble Street **at noon on April 13th 1742**.
- The first recorded date of Christmas being celebrated on December 25th was in **336**, during the time of the Roman Emperor Constantine (he was the first Christian Roman Emperor). A few years later, Pope Julius I officially declared that the birth of Jesus would be celebrated on the 25th of December.
- Alert, in the Qikiqtaaluk Region, Nunavut, Canada, is the northernmost permanently inhabited place in the world. It lies just 817 km (508 mi) from the North Pole.
- The first Christmas trees, in medieval mystery plays, were decorated with **apples** to represent the forbidden fruit.
- Christmas Day (or sunset on Christmas Eve) initiates the season of Christmastide, which historically in the West lasts **twelve days** and culminates on Twelfth Night.
- "Silent Night" was first sung as part of a church service in Austria. **A guitar** was used for accompaniment because the church organ had been destroyed by mice.
- Slices of Christopsomo, or "Christ bread", are offered to the **first beggar** or stranger who comes to the house.
- The Treaty of Ghent ended the **War of 1812** between the United States and Great Britain. Peace negotiations began in Ghent, Belgium, starting in August of 1814. After four months of talks, the treaty was signed on December 24, 1814.
- An old **Polish** custom exists, observed to this day in small villages: a Christmas tree is turned upside down and hung from the ceiling to represent the holy trinity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
