#### **Ruminations** ....

As deadlines go, the last few bulletins needed to be submitted to the service before Christmas. Even the Epiphany bulletin was completed the week before Christmas, so although there was a Bulletin dated in the New Year, this is the first Rumination created in 2022. Prior to Christmas, the real stress was the anticipation of the first Mass of Christmas Eve. The 4:30 pm Mass is by far the busiest of the whole year. Under normal circumstances, that 'getter done' Mass was beyond standing room only. So in the buildup during a pandemic, a lot of energy was spent worrying about the crowds, the limits, locking doors early and turning people away. I was truly hoping for the churches to be closed just for that weekend. As it turned out, common sense and precautions won the day and a very manageable and sane amount of people showed up. After the numbers were tallied, just over 100 people came in person, and a huge burden was lifted. The rest of Christmas was a piece of cake. I think that nervous anxiety took a bit of a toll and the week afterwards was a bit exhausting rife with power naps galore. It could be too that I was on hospital beeper and it did go off on Christmas morning around 5:00 am. As I dragged myself downstairs, I checked to make sure that Santa had already arrived and seeing the coal in my stocking, I knew he had done his business. The person did pass away shortly after I had visited him in ICU, and it was fun talking to the nurses who were soon finishing their shifts and heading home to young children who were also awake waiting for mom to come home and discover Santa's deliveries. Plans for Christmas day were curtailed as Covid was running rampant through my brother's house so I was just as glad to remain at home and just veg out. I was overdosing on binge watching 'Blue Bloods' which seemed to be on 24 hours a day. When it came to for my Christmas dinner, I opted not to order my typical Chinese food. I had a fancy for fried egg sandwiches. I made my way to the kitchen and as I opened the fridge, I saw bacon and cheese, so I made a light garlic butter for the toast, fried up the eggs and lavered them on the bread with the cheese and bacon, toasted Christmas with a big glass of diet Cranberry juice, and polished the meal off with peach yogurt with added peach slices. It tasted unbelievable and I would have chosen that over turkey dinner anytime, though I must confess I did miss dressing so for the next time grocery shopping I picked up a box of Stovetop Dressing - it was on sale. It certainly did not taste anything near as good as mom's, and it really didn't quench the itch of dressing. Nothing ventured, nothing gained. After that royal feast, I sat down with a cup of hot chocolate and instead of calling my brothers I opted to text them best wishes and saved the phone call for New Year's Day. It is funny how guickly the poinsettias and trees lose their magic. And just like that Christmas has come and gone for another year.

Every year the Archdiocese asks us to assemble our sacramental statistics for the year just finished. It is rather interesting to quantify some of the activities that made up our year. We call it the hatched, matched & dispatched statistics.

Here is what happened last year.

#### We celebrated

64 baptisms

71 children were welcomed to the Table of the Lord for the first time.

73 young people completed their initiation into full membership through Confirmation

2 weddings took place

35 funerals were celebrated.

#### The Latest CoVid Protocols

The Archdiocese has sent us an update of the restrictions brought on this week as a result of the latest Government announcements.

Our numbers at worship, including Mass, baptisms, weddings, funerals and prayer services are unaffected. These have been capped at 50% capacity, but with the social distancing restrictions, we remain well under the limit, so effectively there is no change here.

Gatherings in person are once again suspended until further notice, and this includes bible study, sacraments catechesis, prayer shawl ministry and the like.

The Parish Office hours will be curtailed to in person visits.

Congregational singing is to be suspended once again.

People who are feeling unwell, part of the vulnerable sector, or who have been exposed to someone with CoVid should remain home and tune in on line. Parishioners are to be discouraged from gathering and talking before and after Mass. Contact tracing is to remain in effect, including emails for ease of contact.


