



The Latest Covid Protocols

The Archdiocese has sent us an update of the restrictions brought on this week as a result of the latest Government announcements.

Our numbers at worship, including Mass, baptisms, weddings, funerals and prayer services are unaffected. These have been capped at 50% capacity, but with the social distancing restrictions, we remain well under the limit, so effectively there is no change here.

Gatherings in person are once again suspended until further notice, and this includes bible study, sacraments catechesis, prayer shawl ministry and the like.

The Parish Office hours will be curtailed to in person visits.

Congregational singing is to be suspended once again.

People who are feeling unwell, part of the vulnerable sector, or who have been exposed to someone with CoVid should remain home and tune in on line. Parishioners are to be discouraged from gathering and talking before and after Mass. Contact tracing is to remain in effect, including emails for ease of contact.


