



Growing up, reading for pleasure would not have made my top 100 things to do. We were a sports family and between hockey and baseball and lacrosse and judo, and swimming, there was little time for something so time consuming and inert. One of my classmates was an avid reader and his vocabulary proved it and when he had to get glasses in grade three, we just assumed it was because he read too much. I didn't want glasses and the surest way to prevent that was to do anything else but read. My favorite reading adventure was in grade 7. Our teacher, Miss Moriarty, every once in a while would make us clear our desks and we could put our heads on the desk and close our eyes, and she would read a continuing saga of an exciting book called 'Cue for I think we all loved hearing the adventures of Peter Browning. That was my first time thinking that perhaps reading could be fun and not just something for nerds. Somewhere along the line, reading became a bit more of an activity. Fiction books were never really that interesting to me, though I must confess, I loved each Christmas when the latest John Grisham books came out because that was my guilty pleasure when after Christmas I headed out to Whistler. Just before the pandemic, my sitting room was painted. After nine years of seeing the dated ragged painted wall, it was time for something clean and basic, a nice off white which brightened the room incredibly. It meant though that the two bookshelves and two tables had to be cleared of the books so they could be moved away providing access to the walls for the three coatings of paint. BTW it looks great, but I had piles and piles of books in the middle of the room. This would be a great chance to purge. It has sat there for almost the two years of the pandemic and every time I walked by, I knew I had to get to it. I had no idea where to give away books. Places have become very particular in accepting used books. Now I have a huge selection of books that would appeal only to liturgy people. There are books on the technicalities of myths and storytelling, of symbols and symbolic communication. Many of these were text books I used at the University of Notre Dame. These may be acceptable for the Seminary Library at St. Augustine's. I have started boxing them and I already have three boxes filled for the local library, hoping these are books that they can use or sell. The best thing is that they will be off my shelves. I figure I have made my way through about a guarter of the stacks, and I think my next box will be all the various Peanuts books I have. I love having them, but the reality is that they may prove more useful and more used somewhere else where a whole new generation of young people can be introduced into the wisdom and

enduring spirituality of Charles Schulz. I guess my New Year's resolution to lose weight has been transferred to losing the weight of shelves and shelves of books that look great, but in all likelihood I won't be opening again. Plus, I need the room for the new crop of books waiting on my desk to crack them open. The truth be known, I do feel lighter with every box of books I remove from the room. Good thing, I just bought three more books to read. If only that could be translated to my bathroom scales.
