Ruminations

Music has a powerful affect and a lasting impact on us. This week the song floating through my head was Joni Mitchell's 'they tore down Paradise and put up a parking lot.' I know the reason this became the most recent ear worm – there was an open house for my elementary school this week, St. Charles on the Marsh. I was kind of thinking that there was this dark cloud hovering over me because I realized now that my Church of baptism – demolished; my Church of first communion and confirmation – demolished; my high school – demolished; my old rectory in Victoria Harbour- demolished. And if the truth be known, I was part of two rectories up north that were also razed to make way for more parking. There were many more reasons why this was the case. The extra parking was just a bonus and not the driving force. I figured that it was almost 48 years since I left those hallowed halls of the School and ventured forth into High School, and my youngest brother finally left those premised four years later, so for eleven years, that little school, prone to floods and swampy play grounds because of being on the marsh was an important hub for lives- sports teams, Christmas concerts, verse speaking, fields trips and graduations. Considering most of my class had been together since kindergarten, it was a tight knit community. Every morning catching the bus to drive to the boonies where there were few houses around the school. There was the girls' side and the boys' side. Girls could go on the boys' side but not vice versa, and likely for good reason – the boys' side had the yard, the grass, the baseball field and the girls' side had the pavement. The older grades were allowed to pass over the girls' side to get to the parking lot where we played ball hockey, though we didn't use a ball, we used a crushed tin can. The whole school was on one straight axis, except for a bit of an addition which contained the kindergarten class. I remember the huge set of stairs that split the main hall that led to the upper floor. Funny, it didn't look too impressive at the open house. In fact, the gym seemed miniscule by today's standards, and the same holds true for all the classrooms. The table displays of past class pictures only went back a couple of decades, and I bet some of the young students figured we didn't have cameras back then for any photos. A couple of my teachers were present, my grade 8 teacher and my grade 5 teacher. I think my grade 5 teacher was one of my first crushed. She was young and fresh out of teacher's college and when we had our annual skating party and we walked to the Bradford arena, 3 kilometers away, and then her fiancé showed up, a 6'4" police officer, it was time to move on. Our principal, who was there for 20 years, also taught us math and we had grammar lessons on Fridays. He was so thorough that it wasn't until grade 13 that I learned a new concept in grammar called a nominal absolute. I was happy to see the statue of St. Charles Borromeo was still there but what was blatantly missing was the big picture of the Pope that hung across from the Office. Detentions were spent under the illustrious painting of Pope Paul VI. An awful lot of students got very acquainted with Pope Paul – my cousin who was in my class, being one of them. I on the other hand.... Such found and I am afraid distant memories of a wonderful toboggan hill, and snow ball area, and squishing crayfish up from the swampy ground, and the hundreds of people from the many generations that have graduated from there I am sure have their own stories that knit the fabric of that little school on the Marsh. It will be sad when it is demolished this summer, but the good news is, there is a big, beautiful, modern school right behind it ready to open its doors as the new and improved St. Charles, and a whole host of young people ready to write their own chapters and create their own memories and in 48 years return to an open house and wonder where the time went. Oh what a revelation of how life goes on.
