Ruminations

They say that if March comes in like a lion, it goes out like a lamb. I have been searching for a similar saying concerning summer. Let's just say it has come in as a bit of a maelstrom. This past week has been the beginning of Graduation Week. This is the week that our Parish Hall and church are rife with excited grade 8 students, proud parents of grade 8 students, and relieved and exhausted teachers of grade 8 students. Because our facilities work so well this type of event, and of course, we only ask the schools for a donation rather than our regular fee, our hall is in use almost every night for a week and a half. Coordinating the comings and goings of schools, and parents' decorating committees, and set ups and take downs, it is a job unto itself. Well guess which office staff contracted Covid, and not just the symptomatic kind, but the hard to breath, achy, loss of taste kind. The office was closed for the week. Then the new ventilation hood for the kitchen was delayed by a couple of days because the company was the victim of a rash of catalytic convertor thefts in Barrie. In the meantime, the new appliances for the kitchen were scheduled to arrive, timed so they would be out of the way while the new ventilation and fire suppression system were being installed. They happened to arrive a day early which even if they were on time, they were still going to be early. So as I was eating supper I reached for some ice cubes from the freezer, and they were just a puddle of water. The fridge wasn't working. Luckily the diagnostic panel indicated that it needed a new air filter. With Youtube beside me I figured out how to open the panel. I discovered that no one had installed the air filter when we purchased it three years ago. Do you know how hard it is to get a refrigerator repairman on a quick call? Meanwhile all the freezer contents and the fridge food stuffs all had to be discarded. The house keeper must have been on the phone for six hours trying to negotiate people to come. Finally a fellow came two days later and said that it would be smarter to buy a new one, that the repairs would be over \$1,000. Finally she got hold of the manufacturers, L.G. There must be a problem with the appliance because they have this deal of buying a warranty for a set cost which will over the cost of the repairs. They cannot come though until next week. That will be 8 days without a refrigerator. My coke Zero is all warm now. As that was going on, and phone calls going back and forth, and helping schools set up, it was almost mom's birthday and I had to sneak up and see her. Every time I looked to go, another issue cropped up, so late in the afternoon I just left everything and went to see her. When I got back and collected the mail, there was an important letter from the Ministry of the Attorney General – I have been called to Jury Duty. I have been on the jury panel before and was called to the selection room. Once they found out I was a seminarian, I was dismissed. This will be the fourth time I have been called to duty, and to be honest, I think it is exciting. Unfortunately it doesn't quite work with my schedule. In fact, there are two weddings that week, both on weekdays and not on the weekend. Funerals pop up unexpectedly, like just now I got an email asking for my availability. So I guess I have to go to the Court House and plead my cause, though shutting down weekday masses for three weeks (the possible duration of the duty panel), but the last two times I was summoned, they excused me. Maybe summer will go out as a mellow lamb, and a heck of a lot cooler.
