



Ruminations

August has always been a rather melancholy month. It is the beginning of the end. It signals that the end of the summer is near, and the countdown until the start of school begins in earnest. The television is filled with back-to-school commercials and the death-knell of holidays is the start of the Canadian National Exhibition. Dad always took his three weeks of vacation at the end of August and that meant that those last days before school were a hub of activity. It was a determined time to get chores done around the house. It was also a time when we would journey up to the cottage. Now to refer to the cottage as quaint and rustic is a gross understatement. It was used as a hunting shelter. There was no electricity – no running water, and no indoor facilities. Lighting was by naphtha lanterns. It was on its own small lake, and there was no one around for miles. On occasion a plane might fly overhead, but that was the only sound of civilization. We were left to the cacophony of summer insects, frogs, birds, and the ever present lonesome call of the loons. There was evidence of bears on the shore of the lake, huge footprints, and that meant that we were not allowed to casually stroll through the forest. It was a pretty primitive adventure. One year we went with a real estate agent. Mom & dad, likely mostly dad, was interested in purchasing land. There was a parcel of land on a peninsula up by Restoule, just south of North Bay. It had a number of cottages and lots of fishing and hunting in the vicinity. Dad was kind of excited about the prospect. enthusiastically described how we all could be fishing guides and hunting guides for people who stayed at the cottage. He was barking up the wrong tree with me. I don't do fishing or hunting - not out of any great moral stance, but because I don't touch worms, or fish, or dead animals unless they are on a fresh bun. My dad who grew up as a very outdoorsman really couldn't get his head around the fact that his oldest son was passionately dis-interested. I think my brothers were kind of keen on the idea. They had visions of Davy Crockett, 'King of the Wild Frontier" which as a popular television show at the time. The discussions were going too far and too in depth for my liking. The car ride back to the cottage was an excited banter about the possibilities, at least for five of them in the car. I was silent. When the discussions turned to schooling, I had a glimmer of hope that it wouldn't take place. Our journey to school would begin each day with a boat ride to the other side of the lake, but during the transition period of the lake freezing over or melting, school attendance would be dubious. We may not be able to catch the bus and high school was over forty miles away. As much at boating or ski-doing to the bus stop was enticing, the merciful verdict came in – schooling was too important to trifle with, moving was a no go. Through the mystery of family inheritances, the cottage was funnelled down to cousins who have torn down the old building (if it didn't fall down first) ad constructed a more modern facility. I haven't seen those

cousins in well over forty years. But looking back the talk of living off the grid, we did that every summer, and if the truth be known, there is a lot about the grid for which I am very thankful.


