Ruminations

First days of school are filled with potential and excitement. They kind of all blend into an experience rather than an event in my recollections. The ones that were memorable are such more for their misadventures rather than their adventures. There was the first day of kindergarten when mom was dropping me off with three younger brothers in tow, and one of the middle brothers didn't want to leave me and started running and hiding in the classroom. There was the first day of high school, spent in the principal's office because the classroom timetable was for an 'R' Roberts, but he happened to be in grade 12, so once I found the classroom and stepped in, I knew something was amiss. As smart as I thought I was, I figured a leap over grade 9 through 11 was daunting, even for me, so I spent the whole day sitting around and received the timetable the next day. My actual first day of classes in high school was spent trying to find the empty desk in a classroom where all the other students had already staked their territory. It is hard to talk about the first day of university as the whole registration week needed to be included as part of the adventure. There were no computers or print outs, and it seemed you needed a masters' degree to figure it all out. Luckily for us frosh, the people from residence, especially the ones in the same course but further along in years, walked us through it and even came to the 'Great Hall' to help us navigate the ordeal. There were forms to fill out that meant we were applying for a particular class at a specific time. Great advice was to avoid the 3 hour version of a class and try to get in for a 1 hour three times a week version. I did get stuck with a three hour sociology class on a Thursday night, being taught by the father of an up and coming swimming star, Alex Bauman, but after week two there was an opening in another timeslot that was only an hour in duration. I jumped at it and learned my lesson about how to create a timetable. My roommate had warned me. Each day of that first week was like a series of beginnings. Some of the classes had over 100 students, but in my specialized major, there were only 25 people, and it took about half an hour for our professor who was also the dean of our program to get to know our names. Ten years after graduation, I returned to the campus as a priest, tagging along with a High School basketball team that made it to OFSSA. As I was walking across the Phys. Ed complex that same director made a bee-line to me, called me by name, and struck up a conversation to catch up. It was a bit unnerving as it took me a few seconds to recall his name, and then feeling like I had to explain how I went from Sports Administration to priesthood. He seemed less phased by it than I did. though he was quick to inform me of some of the 'real jobs' that some of my classmates had found; director of operations with the Montreal Expos; vice chairperson of the Canada Games; Diving Ontario, Maple Leafs front office; Sports Hall of Fame, etc. Well those are my most vivid memories of school openings, and



memories of school openings, and they seem so long ago but also not so long ago. Time is a peculiar mystery. So for all those first day jitters, enjoy the adventure because before you know it, you will be sitting reminiscing about events from over half a century before. How did that happen?

Registration is for children who worship with us each week. If you belong to another parish, check with them for their requirements. The Sacraments are celebrated in the parish where you worship/belong, not in the parish where the school is located.

Children who are not baptized or were baptised in a non-Catholic denomination must see either Jennifer or Fr. Roy before submitting the registration forms.


