

Ruminations

My elementary school was torn down this summer, but not before a big, new beautiful replacement was ready on the property behind it. In fact, they leveled what was our tobogganing hill to build it. The grand opening and blessing of the school was to take place this past Friday, November 04, the feast of St. Charles Borromeo, which, funny enough is the name of the School. As an alumnus who graduated last century, I was invited to the blessing along with the pastor of Holy Martyrs of Japan in Bradford, and our regional Bishop. Unfortunately with the uncertainty of the educational system it has been postponed. The excitement about this new start for the staff and students, (it pains me to admit that most of the teachers, let alone the students, weren't even born when I graduated from this little school on the Marsh), has generated so many memories of people and events long passed. I remember in the upper grades participating in a Remembrance Day poster contest for the Bradford Legion. Each of the schools could submit one poster per grade level. Back when the schools provided paper, and pencils and rulers, and art supplies, we were offered a Bristol board for our art masterpieces. I sketched out a draft before transferring it to the larger canvas. It was replete with poppies and clouds and birds bearing banners with the values and ideals that were won for us, like freedom, with a large tombstone in the middle inviting those who offered the ultimate sacrifice to Rest in Peace. Along the bottom in large print was the title 'Rememberance Day". It was a work of art and in my humble opinion, it was worthy of moving on representing St. Charles School, and in fact, winning the overall prize. So on display day, I proudly, and confidently, and you may find this hard to believe, but maybe even with a bit of cockiness, brought it to school for the adjudication. As I unrolled it there were great guffaws and gasps of wonder and admiration. Amid back slaps and congratulations, our teacher came to inspect it and admitted how beautiful it was, and then there was this 'but' with a great pregnant pause. After an interminable pause, it was pointed out that I had a glaring spelling mistake on it. I had spelled remembrance' incorrectly. Talk about bursting one's bubble. My mind raced trying to devise a way of hiding, or correcting this mistake, but there was no way of doing so. All the hopes and expectations of prizes and rewards went down the drain. It was with great exasperation that I conceded that the obvious winning poster will not see the light of day. I can't remember if the inferior piece that was sent on to the contest won anything at all. I think there was always a winner and then everyone else was deemed runner up. I think that experience kind of tainted my view of Remembrance Day until I had completed my basic training in the Navy. There was a program for seminarians to do basic training with the Navy reserves and receive a commission. The following summer I worked as a chaplain at Base Borden after which I was discharged, with an open door to joining the military on loan for the diocese. By that time, I had become an uncle and as

much as the military communities would be wonderful to work with, I had no desire to be a long distance uncle. It was the best choice and I have loved being immersed in those family dynamics. I still remember the great Remembrance Day spelling debacle, but I have an whole new thankful appreciation for those willing to sacrifice for higher principles and values. Happy Remembrance Day. Fr. 
