Ruminations

Let's just say that the decorating of the house for most occasions was left to me, that is except the jack-o-lantern at Hallowe'en. My brothers were mostly indifferent, mom had little concept of scale, and colour combinations, and, well, my dad and I had very different opinions about what constituted a finished look. He was wrong, and I was right. About the time that I was amassing a bank account- and had a job, Upper Canada Mall opened. The store of choice and inspiration was Sears. The Christmas season didn't begin back then until well after Remembrance Day, more toward the end of November. Sears was the first real store that did a fancy Christmas display the oversized Christmas balls, and trees, the hangings from pillars. It was always a festive feel filled with magic and awe. I would spend way too much time wondering through the Christmas decoration department imagining how every little trinket and adornment could fit into our house, though if the truth be known, we would have had to double or triple the size of our house to accommodate my vision, let alone win the lottery to pay for the garlands and wreaths. I was always fascinated by Christmas lights, indoor and outdoor sets. This was always a bone of contention between dad and I. I think I would describe him as a bit of a minimalist, or maybe a huge minimalist. I on the other hand, had an innate sense that when it comes to lights, more is better. Once I had my own money, it became a moot point – I could purchase whatever I wanted, and since I was in charge of the decorating, dad just kind of conceded, though I think secretly he loved the end results. Of course, back then, the variety and selection of options was extremely limited, and if we had had the same selection as we do today, I likely would not have been able to pay for university. I remember the one year that the focus early on in the season was getting our Advent wreath set up. I saw really cute candle holders in the shape of kneeling angels that would hold a taper candle. If I remember correctly, they were whimsical in a formal sort of way. The price tag was a bit of a gulper, and I think my Scottish frugalness kicked in. I wandered around the store talking myself into it and then talking myself out of it. I eventually went home empty handed and discussed my find with mom. As I said, dad's taste and mine were polar opposites and mom was much easier to convince. I decided that I would purchase- a pair of them, and then maybe after Christmas if there was another pair on sale... As my luck would have it, after Christmas they were sold out. I hoped that when Christmas shopping rolled around the next year, I would be able to pick up the second pair. Unlike stores like Homesense, you could count on a bit of yearly continuity and finding the item again. The next December, the candle holders were again in stock and I snatched another pair without any deliberations. Our artificial wreath with the four angels holding the requisite purple and pink candles adorned our living room. For years the candle holders would be delicately wrapped and stored, only to be retrieved for the start of Advent. I can't remember how long those magical holders survived, but do remember the day mom called and was bragging about this or that antic of one of the grandkids who were visiting. Sort of in passing, to kind of camouflage the news, she informed me that a certain nephew, who shall remain nameless, was fascinated by the candle



holder and accidently knocked all four of them over. Two were broken beyond compare and the other two had chipped. I immediately took that nephew out of my will, but have subsequently forgiven him — an occupational hazard. Happy Advent.

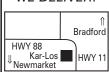
