Ruminations

The first trophy I ever won, long before the penchant for awarding everyone a trophy for anything, was in grade two for Verse Speaking. The PTA would host an annual Verse Speaking and Public Speaking contest. In grade one I was selected from the class at St. Mary's School in Bradford by my teacher Ms. MacGregor. I have little recollection of that event and certainly no memory of what poem I recited, but the popular opinion was that I should have won, standing there with my brush cut hair, and all my toothlessness, but it was awarded to a grade two student. I had no disappointment because I had no notion of a competition. The next year, we were shipped to another school, St. Charles, out on the Holland marsh. As the time rolled round for the annual competition, I was once again selected from the class. I have a bit more memory of this event. The poem was something about six little puppies. Mom said that I was more comfortable up on stage, to the point of being a bit cocky. I can't imagine such a thing. As luck would have it, I was presented with the winning trophy. Again, what does a trophy mean to a grade two. The hype and competitive spirit that has been generated in today's world just creates too much anxiety, and not enough fun. That was the last time I was allowed to enter into the competition which was fine. There was one poem I remember that was very popular in the upper grades; 'Daddy fell into the Pond'. It was a humorous adventure that on a boring summer day, life quickened when daddy fell into the pond. It painted a funny image of an adult falling. Well, as I get older with my own adventures, I have a slightly different take on that notion of falling. Since my spine operation over twelve years ago, walking can be an exercise in caution and trepidation. Running up or down stairs is just not in the cards anymore, and railings and bannisters have become fine friends. I am pretty good at navigating these obstacles that I once took for granted, but last week, I got a subtle reminder to pay attention. I was off on errands and Ikea was one of my stops. I thought of the poem but unfortunately, there was no pond to ease the landing. Luckily I was able to brace myself and protect my glasses from breaking. I'm still not sure how it happened, but it did. Concerned people came around me, and although my forearms took the brunt of it and hurt, and my knees, too, what hurt the most was overhearing some young whipper snapper comment, "Look, that old man fell!'. As for young whipper snappers – not a fan. Anyway, I got up more quickly than I thought I could, dusted my self off, and chuckled to the concerned people that I was fine. I continued on my quest only to find out that the items that were supposed to be in stock, were not.

The computer had lied. I left Ikea with some bruised arms, and knees, but funny enough, my pride was still intact. So if you visit the nativity displays, I do not want anyone to say that some of the backdrops are missing lights. Is there a chiropractor in the house?


