Ruminations

Often I will drive my nephew home. Usually we go up Leslie to the Doane Road with a pitstop at the Tim Horton's Drive Thru, that was until I was chastised for offering gluten to a gluten sensitive person, and cheating with a toasted bagel with cream cheese to someone whose blood sugar numbers need to be severely brought under control. For the most part, the Doane Road still brings me back to my younger years. It was a road of farms and farm animals. It was there that I had my first shock from an electrified fence. It was there that we snuck into the cow field and licked the salt like on a dare. It was a little disconcerting to see big earth movers preparing another farm field for subdivisions, but... We always drive past Anchor Park on the way into the Landing. That little park was a pretty important place growing up. There were summer camps and corn roasts, scavenger hunts, and baseball games. We climbed the rafters in the pavilion and mounted the tip of the Anchor that gives the park its name. We collected acorns off the oak trees and searched the forest for salamanders. We peeled the bark off the red pines, and I have such fond memories of pumping water using the old fashioned hand pump. Of course once the pump was primed and the water began to flow, the first couple of pumps needed to go free before water was being collected. It was always cold and clear and fresh and delicious - beautiful ground water untainted by fluoridation or other industrial treatments. I am sure that my nephew gets tired of hearing about all those escapades of a half century ago, and I sometimes I think I hear his eyes roll. I think there is a small part of the story-telling that is really just self-indulgent. Along that road we have seen deer in the fields, and wild turkeys crowding the side of the road. There was the fox, and the possum, and lots of hawks. It has been over six years since we sold mom's house, and the number of times that I have driven past it I can count on one hand. It was a lazy afternoon, mild and grey so I decided to drive past the house, reminiscing about the great toboggan runs, and growing up on a dirt road where ball hockey nets were piled on the side of the road. What was neat, and made the whole trip down memory lane was turning on one of the side streets and seeing people outside at the house, cleaning up the yard. As I slowly drove by the house, they both looked up and waved without having any inkling of who I was. Waving at passing cars was standard procedure on our street. Of course it was a time when five cars went by in an afternoon, it was considered high traffic. If we had to clear the ball hockey nets twice in an hour, we wondered what was happening. Still, cars stopped to engage in conversations with people on porches or in the gardens and nary a horn was honked. There was an old school feel to it, a gentler time. And no matter how many decades have washed under the bridge, with the monumental leaps in technology, and the supposed progress we have made, a simple little wave to an unknown passer-by bridges time and place and makes it all real. I waved back with a nod of the head and charming smile. Fr. Roy

Your Cancelled Stamps are Valuable!






