

#### **Ruminations** ....

As Mark Twain is often misquoted, "The reports of my death are highly exaggerated." Not speaking of death, but if one is familiar with the rhythm of priests in parish ministry, in the Archdiocese of Toronto, a pastor is installed into a parish for a stint of six years. This is different than associate pastors or administrators. There is no specific term for them. In fact, they can be moved at a moments notice. One of the parishes where I was assigned was Victoria Harbour with a mission church of Mount St. Louis attached. I was made administrator, not pastor and on an Ash Wednesday I was told that I was being re-assigned to another parish on the following Monday. It was a little bit of a rush, and luckily I was early on in my priesthood, and I hadn't yet accumulated 'stuff'. My mom and dad came up to help organize things for the move. Upon being assigned here, my mom called me in early March all in a huff because she had found out I was transferring here and I hadn't told her. It was hard to convince her that it was the first time I heard of it, and I swore that I wasn't moving, as I had heard nothing from the Chancery, and that if I were moving, I would have been informed in January, not March. Two weeks later, on April I<sup>st</sup>, I retrieved a message from my phone from Priests' Personnel informing me that I was indeed moving at the end of June. I had to call my mom and inform her that she was right. Of course, her response was that 'mothers always know'. When I had a conversation for the Personnel Director, I asked him why my mother knew two weeks before I had any inkling, but the answer was utterly unsatisfactory. By that time in my priesthood, I had accumulated a lot of stuff which made the packing exhausting, even allowing for the fact that I had a couple of months versus a couple of days. Over the last few years, I have been trying to de-clutter, and I have packed up over 25 boxes of books that have found other homes. All I have remaining are 10 boxes of my closest, important volumes that I can't part with - yet. Since September I have started hearing rumours and entertaining inquiries about an up-coming move to another parish. I know there have been people who started the countdown to my move since the first day I arrived. They were acutely aware that a priest's duration is 6 six with a second term of 6 years permitted. And so my twelve years are up this lune. In fact, once a priest turns 65, he won't be transferred unless he wants to. I am delighted to say that I am not yet 65 years of age, and so back in October, the Personnel Director began the conversation with me about the completion of my ministry here. Since retirement age for us is 75, that wasn't really an option - just a hope and dream. But there are extenuating circumstances - various cards that I could play. The most poignant one was the fact of my mom having dementia and me being an essential caregiver for her. It is significant, especially when she is taken to hospital. I wrote to the Cardinal pleading my cause, hoping that this card would prove a trump card. The fact that my diabetes medical team, my doctor, my dentist, my optometrist all are local were secondary. Just after Christmas, a letter came from Cardinal

Collins. I took a deep gulp and breathe as I opened it. He thanked me for my recent letter and granted me an indefinite extension. For those who have been counting down they days, reset your clock. So it seems as long as mom holds on, so will I. Once again, mom to the rescue, and she saves the day.
