

### **Ruminations** ....


In the Breviary or the Divine Office, one of the promises a priest makes at Ordination (well at the diaconate Ordination) offers all kinds of intercessions during its Morning & Evening Prayer format. One of those prayers is for artists... It states, "The talent of artists reflect your splendor, may their work give the world hope and joy." I thought about that prayer in earnest on Sunday afternoon. As I sat in the parish hall listening to four very accomplished musicians, two violins, a viola and a cello, make magic with these strings and bows. I have to admit that I am not a huge fan of classical music, and even a lesser fan of public concerts, but as venue host to this effort in support of Ukraine charities, I felt somewhat obliged to attend. I figured it was better than just zoning out on the couch trying to catch my breath after the onslaught of Sunday, especially with the beginning of First Communions. You can only veg so much on reruns of Blue Bloods for so long. I hoped that I wouldn't fall asleep because as someone with sleep apnea, when I saw the ol' logs, it sounds more like a chain saw. I remember one time at a matinee theatre watching this slow unfolding movie, I did nod off and was awoken by someone who was shaking my shoulder waking me up because the other patrons couldn't hear the movie. I am happy to report that happened before I received my CPAP machine. Though I haven't been in a theatre now for over seven years, I haven't fallen asleep in a theatre except that once. I was pretty sure I wasn't going to zone out and add more own chorus to chain saws to the concert, even though there was this inclination to want to shut one's eyes and ride the waves of the purity of the sounds that were emanating from those strings. I'm not sure exactly where these sounds carried me, but it was somewhere wonderful, and peaceful, and desirable. It was like encountering beauty and innocence in all its heavenly echoes. The afternoon started with this wonderful introduction and passionate appeal for peace in Ukraine by Deacon Marian. He gave a brief introduction about the musicians as they took their seats. Then they began by adjusting their strings which in with my vast experience in classical music concerts I thought was the first song and such a musical treat. Apparently it was not, but I enjoyed it none the less. The cello then burst into a familiar song that even I knew, 'Ode to Joy'. I fell in love with the cello, long before the other strings came in. I was so amazed by just the purity of the notes drifting from the instruments, and then how they all beautifully melded together. There was magic in the air. It was mesmerizing watching the bows move in unison and the precision with which tipped and dropped across the arch of the neck, and watching the fingers move up and down the board hitting exactly the right note. There was a couple of times when they would pluck the strings and it gave such a unique sound. As I sat there marveling at such mastery of these instruments. I wished that I could play that like, to bring such joy like that, to participate in the heavenly

music like that. I certainly experienced the difference between playing all the right notes, and playing the music. Alas, I know what it is to bring people to tears with music, every time I sing, people moan and groan and cry. So thank you Deacon Marian for introducing us to Roman and his friends, and I hope that they will come back again. Too bad so few people were present for this little peace of heaven here in our Hall.
