Ruminations

I was recently having a conversation with someone who was saying how enamored they felt living in a small town. They were speaking of Holland Landing. They thought that with only 7,000 people, it was a quaint place to raise children. I had to chuckle to myself thinking back to the old Holland Landing which was an even quainter 500 people. It has grown over ten times what it was when I was growing up. I informed them that there was no stop lights and for the longest time there was no pizzerias, now there are two. We did have two mom and pop general stores, one which served at the Post Office where everyone had their own box. Our box number was 42 and it was at the top. It wasn't until we could insert the key by standing on tip toes that we were allowed to go get the mail. Misplacing the key was a regular occurrence that it was then that we had to ask the clerk if she would be so kind as to get our mail, and inevitably we got the same lecture that she wasn't supposed to do this but... We always got our mail. There was no library or restaurants, and certainly there was no health center or dentist. On this days when we had to visit the tooth doctor, we packed into a taxi (no one had second cars) and made the trip to Aurora, to mom's dentist when she was growing up. There was no local bus service and if three or more cars went down the road, it was considered rush hour and a busy day on the roads. The one inconsistent form of entertainment was the Fire Hall which was just down the road. On those warm summer days when the big engine was pulled out of the hall for a good cleaning, it was fun to go and watch. It was the same fire engine that every year at the end of baseball, the whole team would jump on, grab hold, and be given a ride through the streets as victors of the season. I am sure that such an event would never be allowed now since lawyers rule the world. Another source of entertainment was when we heard the fire siren blare (and since we were four doors down from the hall), was to run down and watch them pull away and then read on the chalk board where the fire was and what kind of fire it was. Predominantly it was a grass fire somewhere. If the alarm happened on a weekend, dad would quickly gather us up and we would chase after the truck and follow them to the fire. There are two fires that I particularly remember. Along with all the other absent things that we didn't have, one of them was a weekly garbage pick up. Most people had a 45 gallon drum that served as a garbage incinerator. Ours was down the back and on a breezy spring day, two years in a row, mom had attempted to incinerate our garbage. Breezy was the important word. Spring lawns were always dry, almost a powder keg and one errant flame-ridden piece of paper was enough to set the grass on fire. So when we heard the fire siren sound, naturally we ran out the door to see where they were going. It looked like they were going right past our house but then they stopped. It was then that we noticed that our backyard was all aflame and the line of the fire was creeping closer to the house. They had it doused in no time but we couldn't wait for dad to arrive home from work - though I'm not so sure that mom was as keen as



we were. The following year, on exactly the same day, it happened again so we knew the routine. It was about that time that weekly garbage pick up was introduced into the Landing. I think our house breathed a sigh of relief. It was now safe from my mother and her arsonist tendencies. And as my nephew begins his time at firefighting school, maybe he is looking to atone for the sins of his grandmother.


