

Ruminations

At the first session of the retreat, well maybe, the second, because the first gathering was actually for dinner on Monday evening. This meal is the point at which you begin to see who is on retreat with you. There are so many priests that the retreat is spread over two weeks. Depending on the scheduling, you may not see some priests for years. That being the case, there is lots of what we affectionately refer to as 'table roulette' going on. This is where you wait and watch to see your buddies and then make a mad dash to open tables so you can catch up. One of the things that rarely happens is that I actually knew everyone at this first supper. So the conversation was rather loud and filled with adventures and misadventures of the last couple of years as we had not met for retreat since our last one in 2019. These table mates were mostly people I had been in the seminary with though there were no classmates. Of the four priests ordained for the Archdiocese of Toronto in my year, I am the last one remaining. Two have left, and the third was retired by the Archdiocese. I kind of think the Bishop should award me with a pin or something as the last priest standing. So at the first chat then, the retreat master, began by reflecting upon the word 'retreat'. He reminded us that although the word is mostly a military word, for us, it is not running away or escaping, but a time or growth and catching our breath – a time of re-acquaintance, and a time of renewal. That is a pretty tall order of two and a half days. Now priests are required by Canon Law (the rules of the Church) to have a week long retreat once a year – time set aside from busy lives to discern the action of God in our own lives, and ministries. That is a wonderful sentiment but in this day and age, highly impractical, and the reality is that if it were left up to the priests to schedule it, well, let's just say it wouldn't get done. Most priests don't or can't schedule their four weeks' vacation each year. Well, enough said. The retreats for the last number of years, maybe even decades, have been held at Nottawasaga Inn in Alliston. It is a beautiful setting. My first retreats were held in Cranberry Inn in Collingwood, and the Holiday Inn in Barrie. But Nottawasaga can accommodate the vast number of priests and the requirements of meeting spaces, prayer spaces and most importantly, eating spaces. I lucked out this year on my room. I am facing west and have a balcony. So I am just now sitting with the patio door open overlooking the river at the back along the golf course. The geese are honking and the birds chirping. I am sitting on the balcony with the computer on my lap watching the rising sun begin to bathe the frost off the fairway. Yes, in mid May, I used that dreaded 'f' word frost. I am a bit pre-occupied wondering how the newly planted flowers are doing back at the Church. I hope they remain unaffected because I went out and purchased specific plants. I had to go to three different Home Depots to collect enough for the vast expanse of the gardens. I bought plants by the flat, cleaning out the store supply. If you are looking for Proven Winners Bubblegum petunias, provided the frost did

not kill them, you will see them wonderfully displayed in about six weeks. My dad always warned me, don't plant your garden until after May 24. Fingers crossed. Now it is back to the next session of the retreat.


