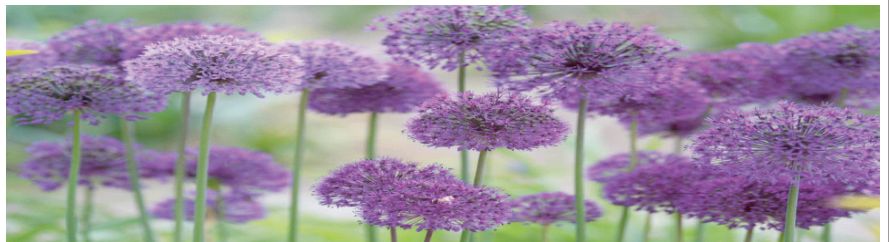

## Ruminations ....

I was so thankful that the CWG worked through the Society of St. Vincent de Paul to arrange to have the container here to receive our surplus clothing. It never ceases to amaze me how many shirts and shorts and socks I accumulate over the course of a year or two. I suddenly have this glut of hangers in my closet, and I can actually see the bottom of my shelves. I think part of the problem was growing up needing larger clothing. I was never able to find shirts in my size. My dad had it even worse. First he had a rather large chest and even more troublesome, he had an exceptionally long torso. They didn't make off the rack shirts that would work for him and we certainly never bought custom clothing. Well, as times change, clothing began to be made in larger sizes. The first store I remember dad feeling happy about shopping in was 'George Richards Big & Tall Men's Dress Store'. It was at the north end of Richmond Hill (before Richmond Hill stole Oak Ridges). I kind of remember dad being gleeful when the occasion arose that he needed to purchase a new shirt. He knew it would be large enough to fit his chest comfortably, and the back tail of the shirt would stay secure in his pants. No fear of plumber jokes here. I too had problems finding shirts that would fit. Every once in a while, a store might have a shirt or t-shirt in my size and it became a habit to pick it up because one was never sure if and when another such piece of clothing would be available. It got to the point that as soon as I spotted my size, it was put into my basket. Well, that size has become much more readily available and my mind knows that there is no sense of urgency pushing me to purchase it now, yet my heart still lives in the fear of never having the proper size. I'm working on that and I am getting better. But the reality is, I still had over four bags of clothing, mostly shirts and sweaters that I somewhat reluctantly offered to the needy through the St. Vincent de Paul. If the truth be told, I still have at least another bag and a half that I could contribute, but baby steps. I also took the occasion to clean out some of my mom's clothes that were still here. It has been over six years and I am finally able to do it. Most of those clothes would never fit her now anyway. They were bought before we realized that her shrinking to a scant 88 pounds was caused by dementia and not her several battles with colon and bladder cancer. There was a bag of her stuff that went. As I was emptying her closet, there were a couple of dressier jackets she had and I still remember the occasions for which they were purchased. For a mom who lived amongst a horde of men, who never really had great dress up occasions, these jackets were a shining example of how she could rise to the level of poise and style that surpassed any hockey banquet department. I stared at those jackets with a sense of appreciation, and thanksgiving, and loss. I couldn't part with them and so they still hang in that closet with much more room to shine. Maybe at the next container from the St. Vincent de Paul I will be able to relinquish them and allow some one else to experience an event dressed to the nines with all the grace and poise that mom brought to them. Time to go shopping and fill up those empty spaces. *Fr. Roy*
