

Ruminations

With a house that backed onto the Holland River, many an adventure happened with the swampy, overgrown, downed tree river's edge being a perfect venue for exploring and plaving. There were muskrats, and groundhogs, lots of birds and squirrels, way too many mosquitos, and on occasion snakes, and of course, the neighbouring property had a pony to keep the grass and weeds down. The most fascinating thing I remember is pulling up snapping turtles. Out at my aunts' farm, they had what seemed like hundreds of painted turtles what would be sunning themselves on downed branches that would slip back into the water as we cruised by in the rowboat. We never saw any snappers in the big pond, but in the Spring, after the Canada Geese hatched their eggs, and were swimming along in single file, bookended by the two parent birds, there always seemed to be one gosling missing from the day before. Those furry paddlers seemed to be fluffy desserts for the big turtles lurking in the depths. Needless to say, we were not allowed to swim in the pond. One summer when my uncle was visiting, he brought his dog. Now this dog was not the brightest of animals. He managed to catch a humungous snapping turtle and dragged it up from the river into our backyard. It was the first real glimpse of this primitive remnant of the dinosaurs, and was it was verv ugly – not in a cute way, but in a scary Jurassic Park way. It wasn't long before my dad and his brother came to investigate, probably to protect us kids, but mostly for the dumb dog before he had a paw ripped off. The turtle had to be returned to the river and so my dad grabbed a shovel, but the beast was too big and squirmy to use the blade so he teased the handle in front of the turtle who quickly chomped down on it and wouldn't let go. My uncle took one side of the shovel and my dad the other and they carried the un-relinquishing turtle back down to the river. Catastrophe averted. It so happened that my uncle offered the dog to us but my dad realized that this dog would not survive long and so we remained dog-less for about ten years until... that fateful day when my youngest brother brought in a new puppy that fit comfortably in his one hand. That dog lived over 17 years, and was way smarter than the other mongrel. In fact, he never once went near the snapping turtles. This memory arose once again when I was dropping my nephew off and there was a little baby turtle crossing the driveway. It was maybe an inch and a half across and was far from any river or creek and heading in the wrong direction. It was a baby snapping turtle. Google tells us that September is the typical hatching time for turtles. We were still wary of getting too close to the jaws and my nephew used a shovel to transport him to the river just down the road. This turtle fit comfortably in the blade of the tool. Before setting the little guy on the right path, we got



another good look at this prehistoric remnant. It looked just like the adult versions, only smaller. We did all admit though, that he was still ugly, but in a cute 'he can't bite my fingers or toes off' kind of way. $\mathcal{P}_{r.} \mathcal{R}_{04}$


