Ruminations

It was great to have Coffee Sunday up and running again. It has been too long. The first weekend though was a bit of a gamble. We had no idea how much coffee to brew, how many tables to set up, or most importantly, how many cookies to purchase. So there was a hiccup or two, but nothing that would derail the event. It seems like a good time was had by all with special thanks to the CWG for hosting the first day and setting us in the right direction. The extra time between masses (this was the first Coffee Sunday with the new mass times) only served to enhance the experience of a relaxed, unrushed gathering of Parishioners. And I am happy to report that no coffee was spilled on the new carpet, though we did find some cookie crumbs which have been sent out for DNA testing to find the culprit. Well, we had have someone pick up cream and milk for the up-coming weekend, and since we ran out of both last week, there is ample now to survive this weekend and beyond. As they brought in the bags of dairy products, I had this sudden flash back. The name Mel came to mind, the vision of an older man in a white uniform driving a big white truck, parking out front our house. Our side door entrance did not have a milk door. For those of the vounger vintage, a milk door was a way that the milkman could drop off a bottle or two of milk, even if no one was home, and the empty bottles could be left there for retrieval, usually at a side door. And if it was really cold out and the bottles were left on the porch, it was not unusual to see a frozen channel of milk overflowing the top of the bottle. I can't remember the frequency of his visits, but I always remembered it with a great sense of anticipation because some days there may be a bottle of chocolate milk left with our order. It seemed everyone knew Mel. He was also in charge of delivering the little mini-bottles of milk to the school. Each Thursday, we would line up down the hall of St. Mary's school to pay for the next week's order. There was something magical about have fresh bottled milk delivered to the school, and for whatever reason, the small paper tabs that acted as lids were the source of amusement, flinging them against the wall to see who could be closest to the wall at recess. Somehow something was lost when the milk changed from bottles to the cardboard containers that we still use today. And the appreciation of a communal effort was lost too. I am sure that it was not Mel who milked the cows, but somehow we had an affiliation with the man who delivered the milk. We were connected to him and he was a well-known and important part of the fabric of Holland Landing. As much as that communal touch has given way to convenience, and expediency all in the name of progress, I have never met the person milking the cows, or bottling it as the dairy, or delivering it to the stores. It is ruthlessly generic. Maybe this is just me getting older or old, but when the milk was dropped off for Coffee Sunday, it brought a little bit of old fashioned

joy, and I realized I miss Mel and all the other people we knew that serviced our community, the Post Office people, the general stores, the gas station attendants, the furnace oil delivery guy, the paper boy, etc. Community was not just the neighbours down the street, but it was the myriad of people who helped the community flourish.

Registrations for First Communion

& Confirmation

For those young people who are in at least Grade 2 are eligible to register for First Communion next Easter Season. Those young people in at least Grade 7 are eligible to enroll in preparations to celebrate Confirmation around Pentecost next Spring.

Registration forms will be available starting the weekend of September 3rd. The last date for registration is Sunday, October 1st after the 11:00 am Mass.

The registration form **must** be accompanied by a Catholic baptism certificate. If you can't find it, call the Church of baptism for a copy.

Children in the Public School or who are home schooled will need to participate in Sacramental Preparation. Registration is for children who worship with us each week. If you belong to another parish, check with them for their requirements. The Sacraments are celebrated in the parish where you worship/belong, not in the parish where the school is located.

Children who are not baptized or were baptised in a non-Catholic denomination must see

either Jennifer or Fr. Roy before submitting the registration forms.






