Ruminations

My mom's older brother was kind of the technological guy of the family – not in a scientific sense, but if a new gadget came out, it was my uncle who would be one to purchase it. When he got one of the early Polaroid cameras, we had a blast taking picture and watching them develop right before our eyes, just like magic. He had a turntable that would be carted out to my grandparents' patio so we could sit out back and listen to the latest albums as we fought the mosquitos. My uncle lived with my grandparents and was kind of their guardian taking care of whatever he could. I remember the year he purchased a tape recorder. Of course whenever he brought it out, we all wanted to speak into it and hear our voices projected back to us. It was always unnerving hearing ourselves and I can't remember how many refrains of "is that really what I sound like?" there were. No one liked the sound of their own voice. It was about the same time I was taking guitar lessons and learning how to play with chords, strumming away. One day when no one was around I took out my guitar and recorded myself singing one of my favorite John Denver songs. When I replayed it, I was beyond disappointed. I realized that a rock hero was not in my future. Instead of hearing the dulcet tones of the next folk artist superstar, I heard someone auditioning to voice the screams and moans of the next exorcist movie. I hated that machine. Often times in classrooms, when children are asking me questions, one of the queries is 'what is the hardest part of being a priest.' I ask them what they think it might be. Depending on the age group, the responses range from celebrating funerals, having conversations with people who are sad, living by myself, or not being able to be married. I tell them weddings are worse than funerals, sad people generally like to hear Jesus' encouraging words, and as an introvert, living by myself it a gift. No, I tell them the hardest part for me is having to sing the parts of the mass that need to be sung. I tell them I have heard how badly I sing. I tell them the true story of one occasion after mass when I thought I did pretty well, some parishioner likened me to a famous opera singer, Pavarotti. He went on to add that it wasn't my voice, but my size. I was always somewhat consoled by the fact that I knew I was not the worst singer, that title belongs to my brother who was cringe-worthy whenever he sang. Well all this arose again after a mass this week in one of the Schools who shall remain nameless. Their choir was doing phenomenally and when my part came to intone the memorial acclamation, three youngsters in the lower grades giggled out loud. It threw me off a bit and in the distraction I lost where I was and started to chuckle too. When it came time to intone the doxology at the end of the Eucharistic prayer, I was nervous and on edge. So I gathered myself and tried in my unskilled best, to sound at

least not humorous. It seems that the three of them were waiting for it and as they burst out laughing again, it spread amongst the rest of the kindergarten class. Whatever! They say kids are brutally honest and I don't fault them. If it is anybody's fault, blame it on God. As someone once said, God gave me this voice, God deserves to hear it in all its screeching horror.

Thank you for your interest in the Newmarket Conference of the Society of St Vincent de Paul.

Our Conference consists of volunteers from both St. Elizabeth Seton and St. John Chrysostom Parishes. Our volunteers serve in many different capacities. As such, we are always looking for volunteers who are willing to use their time and talents in order to serve our less fortunate brothers and sisters within the Newmarket, Holland Landing and East Gwillimbury communities.

Provided below is a summary of the activities and responsibilities of Vincentians:

Our primary method of serving the poor is by providing food gift cards. There are teams of Vincentians that rotate every
Wednesday and deliver food cards to our clients. Other teams assist with packing our Good Food Box (when needed) and deliver the GFB to our clients at home. These systems are in place during for duration of the pandemic.

Some of the other activities and ways to help are as follows:

- Assisting with the distribution of the Good Food Box on-a-monthly basis.
- Assisting with the Christmas Program, or the Giving Tree or the Summer Camp registrations.
- Working with Vincentians to help coordinate the pickup and delivery of small appliances and household goods to our clients.
- Computer expertise (especially around Microsoft Access)
- Coordination of limited hydro or rental assistance payments on behalf of our clients
- Call-out volunteers, to help coordinate the Wednesday Client nights
- Responding to phone messages from people in need of assistance
- Participating in Annual membership drives and/or fundraisers
- Participating in our Annual Mass of Remembrance and taking an active part in the Spiritual development of Vincentians.
- Counting poor box money
- Taking on an Executive position within the conference
- Social Justice Initiatives


