

Ruminations

There are just some weeks when topics to ruminate are few and far between. My nieces and nephews used to be such wonderful fodder, but I promised them that since I moved home, I wouldn't invade their privacy and tell the whole world their foibles and idiosyncrasies. I should have included the rider I clause "so long as I see you at Mass", but that is another topic. I did leave open the option for joyous occasions like graduations, new job hiring's and engagements, or the possibility of becoming a great uncle, but as I keep telling them, I am already a great uncle, just ask me. So far, there have only been the first two, nothing of the sort on the last two. Well, the bulletin is already overdue, and thankfully, since we are only providing an online version, we can cheat a bit on that deadline, but even still, like this week, there is quite the crunch to come up with something. Well it's 5:30 in the morning and the sound of the snowplow scraping the parking lot is the only sound that breaks the silence. I grabbed a bag of frozen broccoli and a bag of frozen peas and sat down in front of my computer with no idea what the direction would. I cozied up the frozen vegetables under and around my foot. Somehow I have bruised or strained my fifth metatarsal which has been the source of my recent limping. Sometimes it is more painful than others, but it is a source of great slowing down in my walking. When they recommend slowing down in life, I don't think this is what they meant. Old people in walkers are passing me by in the stores. Now, up until this curious condition, I had never heard of the first metatarsal, let alone the fifth. I googled it and now I know it is the long bone on the outside of the foot connecting to the baby toe. It connects to the toe what went "wee, wee, wee all the way home". The solution is to ice it and be gentle on it in the day to day activities, like no trampolining or Irish dancing. I promised that I would refrain from both. The unknown factor was decorating the hall with the nativities. Amen.
