

Ruminations

I happen to really love the way we celebrate confirmation. I think it is a step above the usual expressions of the massive group, paraded in, and accompanied only by their sponsor. The reality is, the important people accompanying the candidates ought rightly to be their parents. It is mom and dad who brought them for baptism; it is mon and dad who brought them for first communion; it should be mom and dad who come with them for this last sacrament of initiation. This can also be reflected in the wedding ceremony. In the old days, dad escorted the bride in, mostly because he was given her away to someone who would provide for her, as proved by the size of the dowry. Such an act of giving the bride away would invalidate the marriage. The new ritual expects the bride and groom to walk in together as the ministers of the sacrament, but being a romantic at heart, and knowing the influence of society, for better or worse (usually the later in terms of Church rituals) I will accept a hybrid where dad escort the bride so long as mom does to, back to the point of who brought them to the sacraments in the first place. And was is good for the goose is good for the gander, the oft neglected parents of the groom should escort the young groom as well. (just fyi, the maids and ushers are not considered part of the bridal party but are just eye candy to augment the festivity of the ceremony. The best man and maid of honour, and mom and dad are the wedding party.) So it is great to have the parents included in all aspects of the ceremony. One of the great additions to the journey of our young people to the sealing of their baptism is something we added a few years ago. As an important part of their preparations, they are required to participate in an art project - they are engaged in making a ceramic cross, from its cutting out, and designing, glazing (colouring) and handing, this cross is meant to be an expression of who they are, who they want to be; what things define them; or how they see themselves. We are so fortunate to have a master ceramic artist in the parish. I remember my mom took ceramics, not that she ever created her own, but she would go and pick out a mold, sand it and glaze it and bring it home. Her favorite piece was a statue of Blessed Mary which adorned our living room. Dad built a corner shelf where it sat. On occasion you would enter the room and notice it turned around facing the wall. That meant something bad happened and someone was mad. It could have been because the Leafs lost, or someone failed an exam, or a myriad of other excuses. Mom would dutifully turn it around until the next 'tragedy'. She also made a boat for mashed potatoes. It was huge as it had to be because the amount of mashed potatoes that we could consume in one meal was staggering. The problem was, mom was the only one who liked it. It was shaped like a potato, painted like a potato and looked like a big potato. It's only redeeming quality was that it had a lid. When we were selling the house and sorting through mom's treasures, the fearful question we all had was, who was going to get stuck with the potato boat. No one wanted it, and no one wanted to risk drawing straws for it in case you got stuck with it. I'm not sure where it ended up, and knowing some of my brothers, there was absolutely no sentimentally to mom's craftsmanship with this, so it wouldn't surprise me, that in years to come,

when archeologists dig up the York Region dump, that they may come upon this confounding ceramic vessel that will boggle their minds and make them question the artwork of the last century. Our candidates crosses are much more keep worthy and beautiful- thanks to our resident artist. Thanks Teresa.

Eucharistic outreach

From its earliest days, the Church has always had an awareness that the community exists beyond just those present at the celebration of the Eucharist. Pieces of the Broken Bread were taken home to those who could not physically be present when the community was in-



vited together. The 'Broken Bread' would also be taken home so people could partake of the Eucharist during the rest of the week, long before daily weekday masses were an option. Yes, there was a time when the Church celebrated on Sundays, the Day of the Lord.

This practice truly enshrined in our Catholic psyche a grander notion of Community, and how the Community is diminished by those who are not present when the Community is called to gather "In remembrance" of Jesus' meal. In our day, we have some wonderful people who share in the ministry of Communal Outreach. They bear the Eucharist to those unable to join us for the celebration, physically, but who, through the action of these ministers, become linked to us in a meaningful way by 'communing' with us and with our 'Broken Bread'.

Each week you may see people, ministers to the home-bound, being 'sent' at the end of Mass, to extend our celebration from the confines of our four walls, the community at large. This may be to family members who are sick, or frail, or for whatever reason prevents them from joining us. Some of our ministers are visiting friends and neighbours. Some are visiting

Southlake Hospital to minister to those Catholics laid up in the hospital waiting for tests, or operations, or recovering, or dying. This team of ministers shares this pastoral work with parishioners from St. John's and Our Lady of Grace. The Hospital patients are brought Communion on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays.
