

Ruminations

I still remember that sunny September Saturday when mom and dad dropped me off at the new residence at University for the first time. It is scary to think how many decades ago that was, but even still, it seems like yesterday. No one from my High School knew where Laurentian was, let alone plan to attend, so I was preparing to move into a room with a stranger for a roommate. We didn't have the internet or any means of making a connection with this new person who would be part of my life for the next eight months and maybe beyond. I dropped my suitcases in the room and then took off to wonder the great outdoors for four or five hours trying to talk myself into realizing that this university adventure would prove to be a good and necessary thing for me. By the time I made it back to the residence and timidly entered onto the floor of my room, some uninspiring music was wafting out of my room with its door wide open. I kind of peeked in and there was this large, second year geology student wearing a Bavarian Oktoberfest hat chatting with this fellow whom I discovered was our 'don'. My new roommate, who was affectionately nicknamed the 'Great Root Bear' after the commercial character. It was an awkward introduction with all the awkwardness being mine. roommate was an incredibly friendly and gregarious guy who instantly made me feel welcome despite the fact he was playing weird jazz music as a first impression. He was from a small town relatively close to Sudbury called Nairn Centre on the Spanish River. The truth be told, the word town might be an exaggeration, because when I did get a chance to have the grand tour, it was nothing more than a street divided by a railroad line creating four quadrants. By comparison, Holland Landing seemed like a metropolis. He was a great fit for me. He got me out of my shell fairly quickly and we had lots of great times. He was very generous too. I could listen to his collection of jazz albums whenever I wanted which amounted to zero times. There was a kindness about him and he was truly beloved in the residence. He was trying to sort out his life and after his second year, he switched to another program out of geology and thorough a long, round-about path, ended up becoming a high school shop teacher, and from all reports and comments, he was one of those memorable and favoured teachers that students remember for years to come with great fondness. Over the decades, our lives re-intersected only a few times, the last being one day when he popped into the school gym where we celebrated Mass in Ajax totally unannounced. He just came in and took a seat, and when I finally caught sight of him in the middle of Mass, everyone noticed my happy startled reaction and the tremendous grin that came over me. I introduced him to the congregation along with his new wife whom I had never met until that day. Well, Werner contracted cancer and died in the middle of Covid, and it wasn't until last week that they had an official celebration of his life for the many, many friends and former students. I am still waiting to hear how it went from friends who were able to attend. I owe a debt of gratitude

to him for that first year of University. He helped me settle in and find my stride. He was certainly one of the good ones. Rest in peace, my friend and thank you.
