

Ruminations

I always love the young people celebrating their first communion. I am equally excited at the end of the first communion season. We welcomed over 100 of our young people to the Table for the first time. We have not celebrated near as many second communions, and that is kind of a sad reality that most of those coming to the table will not be seen again, maybe until confirmation. No matter, the rest is God's work to inspire and invite the families to join us each week - it is part of God's job description. I was doing a bit of cleaning through mom's pictures and I came across a picture of my first communion, all the way back to the centennial year, well over half a century ago - gulp. It was a cold and gray spring morning. All I really remember is snippets of the preparation. I think the fear that our grade one teacher and the nun that helped her prepare us is what has endured through the years. Our school was within a 5 minute walk to the Church and so we were marched up there for our practices. It was the same way for our first reconciliation. The only memory of that event was seeing the heavy, dark velvet curtains that provided a semblance of anonymity as we stuffed ourselves into the confessional, waiting for the sliding door to open to hear the old priest lead us through our confession. I also remember the nun teaching us, neigh, threatening us to hold our hands folded in the holiest way possible, because apparently God wants our fingers pointed skyward like an athlete's tribute after scoring a touchdown, and God will withhold God's favour if we don't keep our single file lines exactly straight. I just remember first communion being more about choreography than welcome. Although the church still had its communion rail, it was not in use. We didn't need to go up and kneel at the rail and place our hands under the covering waiting for the priest to file along the line of us. Sister stood a couple of feet in front of the priest ensuring that the boys maintained an arrow straight line and that our hands were folded in the heavenly posture. The same was true for the girls who were on the other side of the aisle, adorned in their bridal gowns because they were becoming brides of Christ. I am sure my grandparents were there, at leas the Catholic ones. Back then it would be almost scandalous to have Protestant family with us. I really have no recollection of a party or even formal dinner at home. I am sure there was something. It was also the day of my brother's birthday so if there was cake, it likely had four candles on it. My cousin made his first communion with me and since they lived across the road, there must have been something happening. If nothing else, they would have been here for the cake. The only thing I remember is anticipating with great joy permission to take the good

Sunday best clothing off and heading outside to play which would have been inevitable with my brothers and cousins. I suppose one might declare it a successful day, if for no other reason than the good clothes survived the event without any grass stains. Fr. Ray

Annual Cemetery Clean Up


The annual spring cleanup of St. John's Cemetery will once again take place on Saturday, May 11 from 9 am to noon
