### **Ruminations** ....

My dad had an ardent love for trees. If it were up to him, our backyard would have been a forest of trees, especially evergreens. It made it quite easy to figure out what gift to get him for his birthday which was mid Spring, and Fathers' Day which is late Spring – a tree. So over the years our back yard was planted with birch trees, and dwarf Alberta spruces, and maple trees. There were already lots of trees, huge old elm trees (which each and every one succumbed to dutch elm disease, and Manitoba maples. Dad would put a lot of work into trimming them up to prevent them from becoming scrub trees. There was another tree at the back that both dad and I had a special affection for - an old, gnarly crab apple tree. Its branches were thick and heavy, and its fruits were mostly inedible and usually filled with worms. But even still, dad kept it trimmed in a shapely umbrella-like silhouette. One of the problems with this tree was the annual infestation of tent caterpillars. It was never a question of 'if' but a question of 'when' they would appear. It seemed like over night the distinct silken mass of the tent would appear, and thousands of creeping crawling caterpillars could be seen swarming along the branches and voraciously chowing down on the leaves. Dad would get the pole, specifically kept from year to year, to be able to reach the higher branches. He would wrap the end of the pole in a gasoline soaked rag and stretch to burn each and every tent that had encamped in the branches. It would almost seem counter-productive, but the efforts scarcely damaged the tree, and before long, the scars seemed to spark a regrowth of leaves to hide it. I remember one year mom had found a recipe to make crab apple jam and she gave it a whirl. With the thought of all those wormy fruits, I couldn't give it a try, and that was the last time she tried it. Besides, it was much easier using the apples from my aunts' orchard for apple jam, apple jelly, apple butter, apple pies and apple crisp. I thought about that tree while away on retreat last week. Things were just exploding into growth with the spring bulbs aglow with colour and the trees budding. I was putting something into my car and suddenly I was taken back by this beautiful aroma that filled the area. I immediately knew what it was - apple blossoms, the same wonderful smell that filled our backyard each Spring. I looked around to find it and there it was, branches filled with the delicate white blossoms with hints of pink. It instantly transported me back to our backyard and standing with dad admiring our old crab-apple. remembered all the time and efforts that dad put into manicuring and protecting that old tree. I remember him trimming branches and raking up the fallen fruit which made such a mess beneath it. I remember him cutting off blossom filled branches to bring them into the house to fill it with the sweet smell of them. It always was a testimony to the magic of creation. The blossoms never lasted long, but while they were in full bloom, we marveled at

their perfection, the pure whiteness and subtle pink, the perfection of the perfume. It was always a high light of the backyard, and when people would visit, with great pride dad would regale them with the story of the crab apple tree, the constant fight with the caterpillars, its tendency to go rogue with suckers and branches, the great vigilance to keep it healthy, all worth it for the reward in the Spring when it burst into blossoms and

perfumed the air.
