Ruminations

I think my memories of summers when school let out is more a blurred amalgamation of the routines that made up the break. The early years were in the era when families had one car, and one car only. There was no local transportation, so other than foot power or bike power, we were stuck in the Landing. Looking back that was not such a bad thing. There was a week long summer camp provided by the 'Township' at Anchor Park and there was always a carayan of the neighbourhood kids parading down to the park, paper bagged lunches in hand. It seemed like a long walk, but the road took us through some reforested pines that just smelled wonderfully of wilderness. And the closer we got to the Park, the more the trees sang the gentle breezes blowing though their tree tops. Even the plague of mosquitos could not dampen the excitement of the summer activities. The only event that I really remember was the annual scavenger hunt through the trees and hills in the Park. The biggest sense of accomplishment was scaling the big anchor which gives the Park its name, and wiggling your way to the peak. Unfortunately there was no such thing as cell phone cameras, and no one thought to bring a polaroid camera, so all the wonderful stances of victory sitting straddled over the anchor worthy of the Titanic 'King of the World' poses are left to memory. Summer also meant staying out at the farm with my grandaunts for a week, usually during the week including July 12. They were fiercely Orange Irish and took great pride in hosting a party for all the local farmers. I'm not sure if they wanted to show off their grand-nephews, or making those catholic kids do work on the Glorious Twelfth. The week also included various outings to Pioneer Village or Bruce's Mill or lake Wilcox for swimming or McMichael Art Gallery where one of the privileges that we lost on young people, was meeting A.Y. Jackson who was in residence there. We were also tasked with clearing the reforestation paths leading along the pond from the 'new' bungalow behind the barn and the orchard to the old farm house. Over the winter trees and branches had fallen and blocked the path, but it was shady and cool. If only we had known about Child Labour Laws... But it also provided a chance to see the geese nests, and the painted turtles who would be sunning themselves on branches that extended into the pond. We also kept tabs on all the goslings and it was an adventure each morning to do a roll call to see how many likely succumbed to the tyranny of the resident snapping turtle. It was always the season for the currents, red and black to be harvested along with the gooseberries. Dessert at dinner would usually be a bowl of red currents served with a bit of cream, sugar, and ice cream. I never cared for the gooseberries though. I think back on sweltering baseball tournaments and lacrosse games in the blast furnaces of the local arenas. Swimming lessons week was always a highlight. That happened when we finally had a second car that allowed us to travel to Gorman Pool in Newmarket, learning to tread water, don life jackets while in the water with our clothes on, and learning (and in my case

unsuccessfully) the dreaded whip kick. Summers for the most part, in those carefree days of youth, even with its requisite boredom and lying on the grass with friends watching and naming the shapes and animals in the summer clouds still have a power over me. As then so now, it is still restorative and settling, nostalgic and innocent. Happy Summer. Fr. Roy
