Ruminations

I'm not sure how many times in the midst of the heat wave I uttered those typically Canadian words, "I wish it were winter", but I can assure you it was more than once. In the midst of the heat and humidity, it was time for our HVAC systems to be serviced to make sure that the church, the offices, the hall and especially the rectory have air conditioning. Now this facility is serviced by five air conditioning units, several of which were replaced over the last decade. The biggest unit on the roof servicing the hall for both air and heating is still the original unit and sadly it is breaking down. It is still working, kind of. It is leaking coolant and it is rather pricey to replace the coolant, one because that coolant is not really available any more, and if it is findable, it is prohibitively expensive. Two experts have both said it is better to replace it than try to upgrade and refit the old one to meet today's standards and coolant requirements. Of course it is the biggest unit on the roof and would require hiring a crane to remove the old one and hoist the new one. Anyway, the real tragedy was that the air conditioning in the house stopped working, and in the middle of that heat wave, my bedroom was a scorching 30+ degrees. With the fan blowing, and several cool showers throughout the course of the night, I survived day one – barely, but repairs could not be done for another six days. Anyway, I purchased a little portable a/c unit that saved the day. Even with the central air conditioning working, cooling the second floor is moderate at best. The bedroom gets direct sunlight for most of the afternoon until the sun sets. I have thought of trying to fry eggs up there it can be that hot, but with the new unit, and the house a/c repaired, it has become very comfortable. Of course, things happen in threes. There was the hall a/c, the house a/c, and then the Kubota lawn mower tractor just stopped. Well, with my prowess and expertise with all things mechanical -NOT, (my worst mark in high school was shop - to this day I still don't know or even care to know, the different types of screwdrivers), the advice was perhaps the battery was dead - and it was, so we replaced it (and I have to say I am pretty darn impressed with myself). That didn't solve the problem. Then the starter solenoid seemed to be the culprit. I have to confess, until this tractor fiasco, I had never ever pronounced the word solenoid - I had never heard of it, and I still don't even know what it does, but with a bit of help, I replaced it. Still no go. So we called the shop where we purchased it and they came to pick it up and repair it (still waiting for it). But the grass was getting too long and so I opted to cut the grass with the push mower. I started in the coolness of early morning, but the grass kept clogging the machine and shutting it down. It needed to be flipped and the wet grass scraped out. So I waited until the dew had been dried up, but now it was getting hot. Visions of a number of funerals of old guys who died cutting grass kept popping into my head. Anyway, as I was pushing, little puffs of smoke kept coming out of the front. I thought it was dying and the grass would need to be left uncut. I kept waiting for the machine to give up the ghost, but it just kept popping out puffs of smoke. Finally I looked closer, and it was not smoke. Because the grass was so long, and some of the clumps of weeds had matured, as the flower heads were being cut, little clouds of pollen when being

thrown up in front of the mower. As I breathed a sigh of relief, I became fearful of allergies, but all was good. I just hope that the tractor will be returned before week's end, otherwise we might be hiring sheep to keep the grass trimmed and short.
