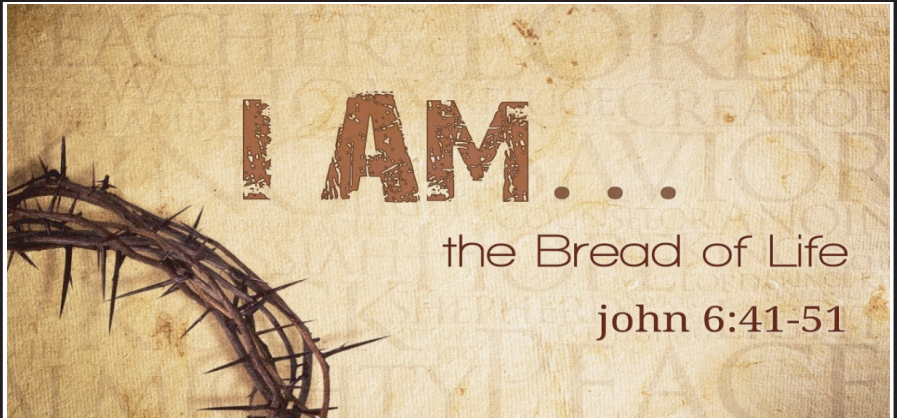

Ruminations

My first visit to the hospital emergency was for a broken knuckle on my left hand. It happened in gym class and it took a couple of days of pain and swelling before I actually consented to go. The x-ray showed a clean crack and I was bandaged up and fitted with a plaster of paris cast. Now this was presenting a bit of a problem because we were in the middle of play offs, so it was the most inopportune time. We figured it would be against the rules to play with a cast on so we disguised it as best we could and I suited up. Let's just say my hockey prowess had little to do with goal scoring and tended more towards stopping goals from happening. No, I was not a goalie, much too smart for that. It did hamper my game a bit, but it seemed kind of Olympian playing under such adversity. My next experience with the hospital experience was about fifteen years later with a sprained ankle. It was a volleyball injury and still affects me today. It involved a month and a half on crutches, three sets of x-rays, and a realization that this injury would never completely heal. In fact, it still hampers life. That was over thirty years ago. The last hospital stay was exactly fourteen years ago this week. It seems turning 50 meant that things started to bulge and a disc in the back was no different. The symptoms revealing the problem were scarier than the diagnosis itself – neck to feet numbness, loss of equilibrium, failing energy. Nothing that a couple of titanium plates couldn't resolve – mostly. The whole experience was a big adventure, from arriving at Sunnybrook at 6 am, to the frustration of the pre-operating team trying to find a vein to insert the IV and giving up leaving it up to the operating room team, the best part of the whole endeavour, the doctor remarking how small my mouth is and he had to struggle a bit to insert the intubation tube. I asked him to write that out for me because no one would ever believe that I have a small mouth and perhaps an official medical doctrine to that effect... Anyway, the truth was, the post-operation pain was not the incision in the neck to get at the spine, it was the residual effects of the intubation tube. I couldn't talk for a couple of days, not that anyone minded. The doctor was a bit disappointed with the results. He hoped that all the symptoms would resolve themselves after going under the knife. The morning after the operation, laying in neurological ICU, the doctor came by to see if I was ready to be released. So long as I could navigate stairs, I could be released. The ICU was not used to discharging patients out of the ICU, usually you were moved to another ward. They had a tough time tracking down my clothes. It took them over an hour to hunt them down so that I could go home. At that remains some balance issues, some residual numbness, and fond memories of great medical teams especially the doctor who diagnosed me with a small mouth. Happy Anniversary, I guess.

Registrations for First Communion & Confirmation
