Ruminations

On the first day of school in my first year of university, we gathered in our Sports Administration class, the 25 people accepted into the program, under the facilitation of our director to begin the journey into the sports world somewhere. We were invited to share what our hopes for our future employment would be. Much of the class wanted to work in the professional sports worlds, hockey, baseball, basketball and the like. Just an indication how many years ago this was, serious professional soccer in North America was a pipedream. There were a couple who wanted provincial leadership at the Ontario Sport and Rec Centre which used to house most of the sports offices in one building. It is no longer there. I was the only candidate who really desired to work for the Canadian Olympic Committee. While the program was filled with professional sports fans, there were a few of us die hard amateur sport aficionados. That was back in the day when amateurs were true amateurs (of course except for the Communist countries and China where the athletes trained as part of the 'military'). There was a perceived innocence and purity about "Citius, altius, fortius" (faster, higher, stronger - the Olympic Motto). The concept of pharmaceutical sports was in its infancy, and the gold medals were measured in commitment and hard work rather than future earning power and sponsorships. My first real memory of the Olympics was Nancy Green's gold medal in Grenoble France in 1968, and the gold medal in the summer Olympics in Mexico for the equestrian team which was more exciting because Jim Day was local. There was a time when I could tell you every medalist from Canada since 1960, probably because there were not that many, but the pursuit of excellence has always fascinated me. So with the acceptance into the limited enrollment program of Sports Administration, I was sure I was destined to be a part of it, and when Canada was chosen for the 1988 Winter Olympics in Calgary, I was convinced that all the ducks were lining up in my favour. Well, my graduation was about a year or two late for a position out west, and by that time, too many scandals, too much cheating, scandalous judging results, and the over professionalization of the 'amateur' sports had tainted the idealism of the once noble pursuits of the Olympics. It had certainly quelled the appetite, and anyway, life was taking a different direction. Still, when I did get a chance to visit Calgary, I had to visit the Olympic venues and it was with great excitement and awe that I dropped by the Olympic Speed Skating Oval. I even rented speed skates to give it a shot. Let's just say that experience dispelled any delusions of dreamy Olympic glories in my fantasy world. Well, I will be visiting Calgary once again in the first week of September. I am accompanying my nephew as he has a job interview with the Fire Department out there. Part of me wants him to get it because I love Calgary and the mountains. Part of me wants him not to get it because it is too far from home. Regardless, in our brief trip there, I plan on taking him by some of those Olympic spots. We will have dinner with my cousins out there and maybe even see one cousin that I haven't seen in over 60 years. He lives a



great distance from Calgary, and his older brother just passed away from ALS so that may not happen. The first time I went to Calgary, I purchased a cowboy hat -I thought it was kind of mandatory. I was threatening to wear it during our trip. I guess I may have to purchase one for him as a memento of this event. crossed though I am not sure how I want the interview to go. Fr. Roy
