

### Ruminations ....

I have used a CPAP machine (a machine for people with sleep apnea) for over twenty years. It has gone with me to California, University of Notre Dame, Bowling Green, Florida, Cuba, Whistler, Prince Edward Island, Edmonton, and now to Calgary. I am currently on my second machine, and it is about time to get a new one, so I have an appointment with the sleep clinic in October. When I get to sleep, not much can wake me up. I have slept through thunderstorms that I only learn about when someone asks if I heard the storm last night. Not much can rouse me, not even alarm clocks. I was finally awoken by an alarm once and I noticed it must have been ringing for 20 minutes before it accomplished its task. This past Sunday, the power went out here at 1:30 in the blessed a.m. I know the exact time because when my CPAP ceased blowing air, I woke up gasping, with great difficulty breathing with the mask obstructing my breathing. I assumed the power would be restored 'shortly' so I lay there for a bit waiting. I got up to check to see if the power outage was just here at the Church but looking out the window, it was obvious it was more extensive. The traffic lights were out, the parking lot lights were out, and all the usual signage lights were dark. decided to get up and check on things. It popped into my head that maybe Sunday mass may need to be cancelled as the darkness could prove to be a hazard, and in our society prone to lawsuits, I was thinking I am too good looking for prison, plus I don't look good in orange. As the time past and there was no power, I decided to start my day in earnest and donned by gym clothes. As a regular course of events, I hit the gym early Sunday mornings as soon as the gym's electronic locks open up (4:00 am). The first indication that maybe it wasn't going to happen was that my garage door wouldn't work, and though it can be opened manually, it seemed like too much of a bother, after all, the gym is just across the road. So I grabbed my gear and headed out the back door. It was dark, really dark. Sometimes we forget how our perceptions of night are artificially influenced by the amount of light in our urban settings. The sky was clear and alive with stars, stars everywhere. It truly was breathtaking. This is what being 'star struck' is truly all about. I was looking at the sky noticing stars that I don't ever remember noticing before- faint little clusters and groupings. I just stood in the middle of the parking lot mesmerized by the magnitude of the beauty of it all and eventually I continued my way. It was a glorious walk across the road but when I got there, the power at the gym was out too, so I sauntered back and I sat down on a patio chair at my back door, admiring the handiwork above me. It was then I discovered that mosquitos don't require much light to find

me, so I went back inside. The power came back on around 5:00 am so I had to go around resetting clocks, and alarms. Mass was not going to be called on account of technical difficulties, but all day I was humming the song 'the night the lights when out in Seton'. Let there be light, but after being spellbound by the beauty of the night sky, let there be a little darkness every once in a while. Fr. Roy
