

Ruminations

Even though the calendar has flipped over to October and we are a couple of weeks into Autumn, this unseasonal weather, which is much appreciated, feels more like the waning days of Summer. Of course the sun is coming up much later and sinking much earlier. It is very noticeable for the Saturday afternoon mass - the foyer lights need to be switched on for the arrival of the parishioners and very much necessary for the departure. Not sure if it is the long-windedness of the deacons' homilies, but is getting pretty dim by 5:30ish. The weather means the gardens are holding their own so the daily task of watering is still in force, but at the height of summer, it was bright enough at 5:30 am to water and weed. Now I need a flashlight or headlight to get those jobs done. The vegetables though are real indicators that the end of the season is nigh. The melon vines are spent and so it was time to clean the pumpkin patch. For whatever reason, the harvest of the vine crops was very meager. There was a couple of healthy looking pumpkins, two very miniature watermelons, zero cantaloupes, and after pulling all the vines, I discovered only two very small cucumbers. It was not a good season for the cucumbers. Last year I was inundated with them, this year, next to nothing. Even the onions seemed stunted, but I finally was able to grow a couple of sunflowers. I planted 30 seeds and ended up with seven. Usually the birds, or the rabbits, or the groundhogs chomp on the young plants, and throughout the season I kept waiting as the seven grew, that one day I would wake to see them gone as well. The peppers and green beans were very prolific – if only I liked them. I'm not sure why I grew them. I guess that my hope was that if they were the fruit of my own labour, they would taste great and I would become a fan of them. It didn't happen so there are a vast number of green beans that have ripened on the trellis beyond the point of being edible. The garlic has long been harvested and the gardens are being prepared for planting next year's crop. tomatoes, even though I neglected them, and they spread in a wild array of stems and branches, produced more cherry tomatoes than I could keep up with, but they are absolutely delicious, and though the onions were a disappointment, the tomatoes so overshadowed the poor performance of the other crops were so worth the effort. I think the soils need a good overhaul and to be amended. Fresh soil and compost are the order of the day. For whatever reason, lots of pure manure makes everything better. Soon enough the rest of the plants will need to be cut back in preparation for the winter. The snow fences will need to be erected to protect the fragile plants from the ravages of winter salting. It should expose the holes of the voles so they can be coaxed to move elsewhere, or exterminated before they do winter damage to any of the flowers by eating their root systems from beneath the ground. And

as we say every year, 'let's get the Christmas lights up while the weather is still favourable', but we never do and then when it is the coldest day of the year, we freeze trying to adorn the evergreens with strings of lights and trim the roof with the Christmas lights. Maybe we will be smart and get prepared earlier. Only seven weeks until the nativity scenes go up. Can Christmas be far behind. (p.s. - only 80 days to Christmas.)


