Ruminations

I can still picture my dad bent over our coffee table in the living room with his paint brush and the PBS artist show hosted by Bill Alexander (the person before the better know Bob Ross) mastering his technique and strokes with his oil paints. Just know that I use the word 'mastering' very loosely. Growing up, I remember meeting A.Y. Jackson at McMichael Art Gallery in Kleinburg. I'm not sure if that had much to do with my love of the Group of Seven art, but I have always been fascinated by their work. My dad on the other hand hated them. It had little time for impressionist paintings and he could not understand how I always leaned toward the Group of Seven or the French Impressionists, or van Gogh. Dad thought a painting should like its subject, which is really amusing because if you ever saw one of his paintings, I would bet money you would not be able to tell what it was. I remember one work that he hung on the wall, I mentioned that it was interesting trees and rocks. Unfortunately, the rocks were supposed to be cows. Nice impressionism, dad. Well, last week I went to the local theatre in Markham. There was a folk play called "Tom Thompson's Wake". It was original songs, soliloquies by three characters, and pictures of paintings by Tom Thompson flashed above and behind the five singers. It was a very simple set. Now Tom Thompson was not an official member of the Group Seven. It was formed after Thompson's death on Canoe Lake in of Algonquin Park, but certainly his spirit and paintings belong rightly in that School of painting. The more I enjoyed it, the more I thought how my dad would have hated it. Not only was it not his style of painting, but a 'musical' was his least favorite form of entertainment. For one of mom and dad's anniversaries, we pooled our money and bought them tickets for Les Mis. When they got home we asked how they liked it. Mom was in awe, and dad sweated trying to feign appreciation. He said it was nice - but he had seen enough musicals for the rest of his life. Message received. It may sound like dad was not much of an artist, but that isn't so. When he worked his medium, great things happened. He did some beautiful woodwork, and his jack-o-lanterns were the talk of the town. People would come down the street just to see them. Anyway, I found that the play was so very inspiring and connected the artists with the very soul of the Canadian wilderness. Maybe that is why I have an affinity for Algonquin When I do go camping there (actually at the Holiday Inn in Park. Hunstville) and I travel into the Park, I have special places that sets my heart at peace, Lake of Two Rivers, where I can sit on the beach for hours admiring the view, breathing the fresh air, and listening to the birds. The other place is Canoe Lake where I love to rent a canoe and enjoy the tranquil waters, and the stunning pines. When I discovered this was the same lake where Tom Thompson drowned, I knew why

it was a sanctuary. I would like to think it is because we would be kindred spirits, but it is not. Maybe just a spark of inspiration and admiration, and maybe that's enough. If you like the Groups of Seven and Tom Thompson, if you ever get a chance to see 'Tom Thompson's Wake' go see it.
