Ruminations

It has been at least 25 years since the venue for our annual priests' retreat in May, and annual conference in October has been at Nottawasaga Inn in Alliston. In the early years the retreat was held at the seminary with the young priests were housed across the field at Scarboro Foreign Missions. WE young priests had to brave the spring weather to trudge on over to the Seminary for the talks and meals - great memories- not of the housing with one washroom for twenty priests, but just remembering being a 'young priest'. Looking around at the menagerie assembled here, there aren't too many more senior than me, including the Cardinal-elect archbishop. As the numbers increased, it was hard to find a place that could accommodate the numbers facilities we would need. MY suggestion of Banff Springs hotel in Banff was summarily rejected, alas. When I arrived at the church, the Office wasn't yet open, and the priest was at the altar celebrating Mass. I kind of wanted to walk up and leave it on his chair, but instead I tried to fit it through the office mail slot figuring they would find it in due time. Anyway, if

it went off, I wouldn't know about it. Out of sight out of mind. I headed back north and made much better time travelling against traffic. In forty minutes, I was back just in time for the first session. In truth, I'm not so sure it would have been a tremendous loss if I was late. Anyway, as they say, timing is everything, in the rising of the sun, in the quiet revealing of the fall colours, and in catching the wisdom or at least enthusiasm of the presenters.

November 1st to the 12th. The candies will be delivered to "Canadian Food for Children" an organiza-




