

Ruminations

The night that dad died has been a bit of contention with mom. She was adamant that dad died at home, on the couch, after laughing uproariously at "whose line is it anyway". The medical system says otherwise, that it occurred an hour later, after midnight, when they got him to the hospital and could be officially pronounced. In all her Irish stubbornness and fighting spirit, she was going to challenge the powers that be. Although dad had been sick for over twenty years, his relatively sudden passing was quite a shock. Well, we have watched mom decline for almost a decade as the ravages of the indiscriminate dementia claimed so much of her memory, her story and her identity. There were some bumps along the way, especially when she took her car for a drive, leaving her purse, wallet, id and cell phone at home. She rolled to a stop in Elmira when she ran out of gas, and she had no idea where she was or what she had done. We had to take her keys away pending an interview with a geriatric specialist whose tests proved it was the right decision. Then when she came to live with me, there were the incidents when she went missing. This prompted us to put her on a crisis list where within three weeks she took about residence at Bradford Valley where she found a home for the last 8 years almost. We did receive a call when she fell and broke her collarbone. We got lots of calls of her falling out of bed. That sounds worse than it was, because they lowered her bed to ground level and placed a mat beside it. When she fell, it was merely a couple of inches. Then there was the episode of what they thought was a bladder infection, and we were asked if we wanted it treated. Turns out it was kidney stones so they put a stint in. Next day the hospital informed us that it was placed in the wrong kidney, so they had to revisit the operation and place a stint in the proper kidney. Luckily, she was hours from going toxic. We that were used to getting calls about different episodes and medical procedures she needed. This past Sunday was a bit different. The team discovered blood in mom's urine and stool. She had battled two bouts of colon cancer, and two bouts of bladder cancer, and so for the last 8 years we were preparing to hear that one or the other had returned. The Home assured us that the doctor would see her the next morning. When the phone rang at 7:30 am Tuesday morning, I figured something was up. The nurse, whom we affectionately refer to as Saint Sue suggested that we might want to rally the troops, that mom had taken a turn for the worst. I arrived by 8 am and mom's friend was already sitting holding her hand. Mom was non-responsive. My other brothers arrived soon after and we were waiting for the youngest to arrive. He had the greatest distance to come, about a two-and-a-half-hour drive. Saint Sue didn't; think he would make it on time. Although the doctor suggested it might be a couple of days, Sue kept checking in telling us what signs to watch. Finally, my one brother asked how we would know that she passed. My sisterin-law the nurse, and my brother said, "She just passed now." It was so gentle, imperceptible, and peaceful. Mom had simply crossed into her new life. We went and got the nurse, and just then my youngest brother arrived. Yep, she was gone. There was a silence at the realization, then hugs and tears, and then laughter at how uneventful it really was. In some ways, mom had been dying to us over the course of the dementia, and her passing was just a blessing. We always knew St. Joseph was the patron saint of a happy death, but I don't really think I knew what that meant until this morning. There was no laboured breathing or gasping for air. There were no groans or moans of pain. There was just serenity and fulfilment. I just had this overwhelming feeling of gratitude for what my mom had survived and thrived in the midst of

adversity, but her story is now put to rest. My brother composed a thought sending her forth, that now she is with dad, and they are now dancing to the music of their love through eternity. So as my youngest brother commented, 'that generation is done, I guess that makes you next old brother. Well done, good and faithful mom.
